### Register Now For Learn-To-Swim Program At YMCA, June 18 To 22

The Annual Learn-To-Swim Campaign sponsored by Wilkes-Barre Central YMCA will be conducted June 18 - 22. Youth in the Back Mountain Area are eligible to participate in this program. Both boys and girls, ages eight through fourteen, will be given five daily lessons during the week of June 18 - 22.

Membership in the YMCA is not required. There is a small fee for instruction and bus transportation to and from Wilkes-Barre.

Bus schedule will be announced at a later date. For general planning purposes, children will leave at approximately 2:30 p. m. and return about 5:45. Lessons are being held in the afternoon this year so as not to conflict with the churches' vacation bible schools in the area.
