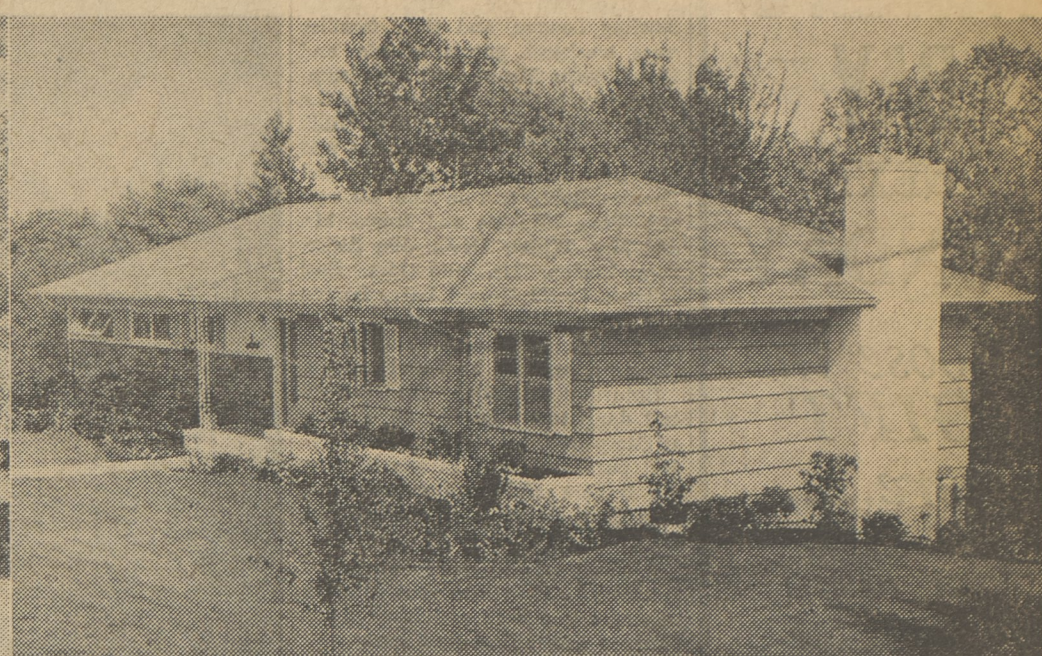
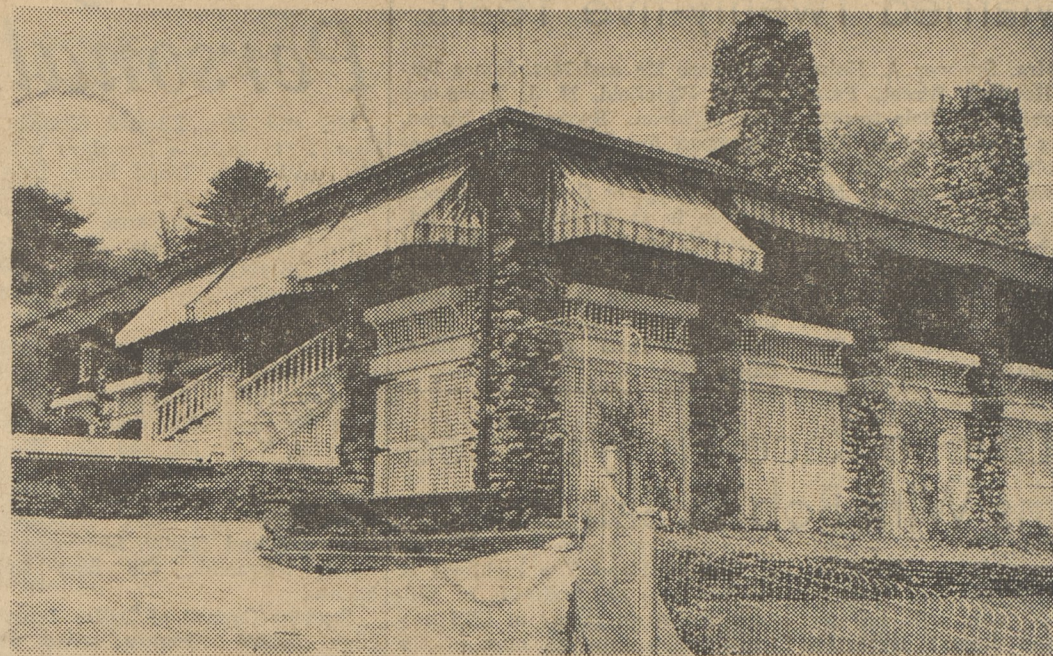


— Four Back Mountain Homes Open For Saturday Tour —

The mulch has proved one thing already: It conserves what little moisture is in the ground, and prevents drying out during the unusually hot weather. Mrs. Brobst says the field could use even more mulch, spoiled hay and straw, etc. Men are asked to cooperate in an interesting experiment by volunteering to haul hay.

Mulching permits planting on top of the soil, seeds and potatoes "cuts" protected by mulch. As the roots strike down into the soil, mulch turns into humus.

Some of the Scouts are gaining their gardeners' badge by working the plot. The prime purpose is to start a treasury for the Scout Mothers, however the scouts will receive a share.

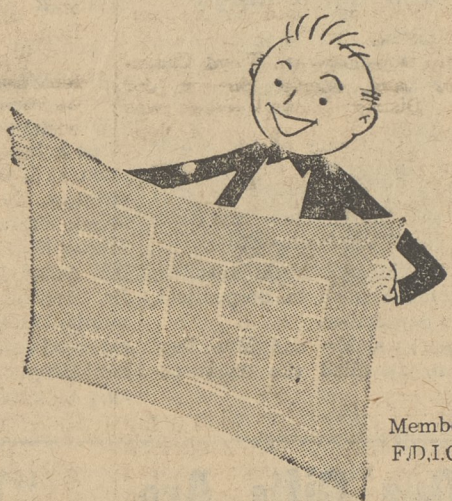

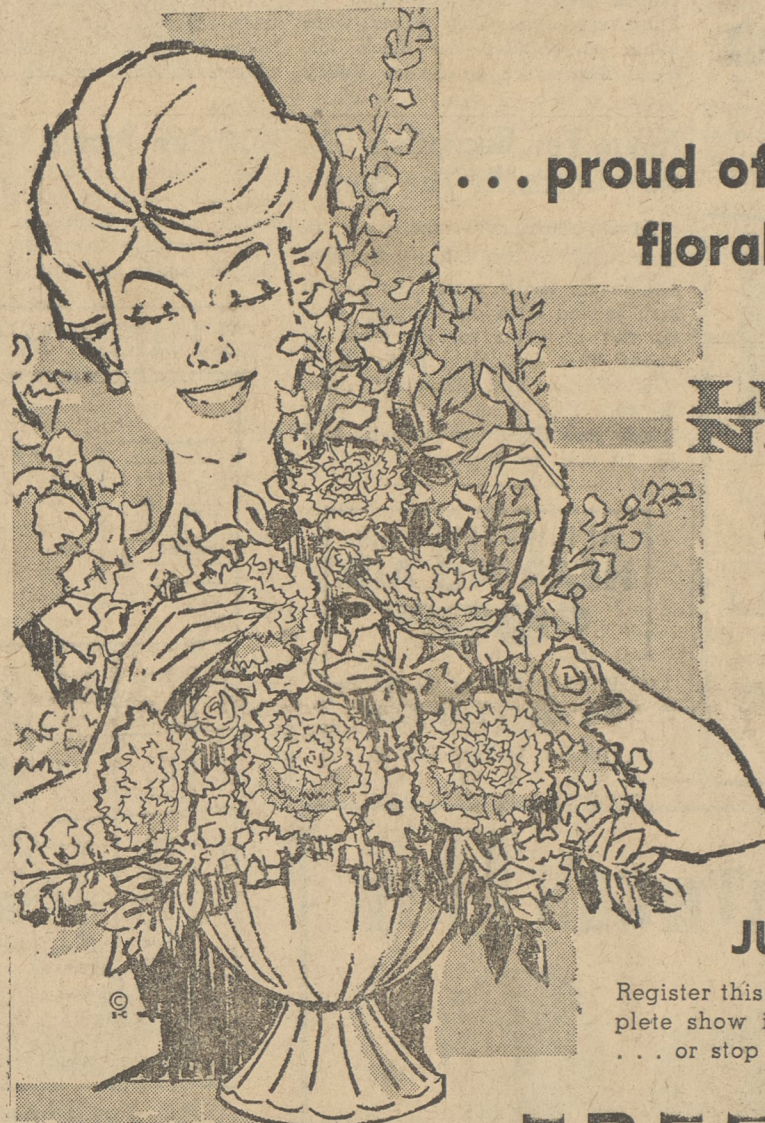
