

Flee Fire Down Ladder As Blaze Cuts Off Stairs

Ide Family Escapes In Night Clothes, Home A Total Loss

Trapped by fire on the second floor of a frame dwelling Saturday morning at 8, three sons of Lehman Fire Chief Joseph Ide made their way to safety down a ladder erected at an open window by a neighbor, Orville, 16, attempting to rush down the stairs, and instantly enveloped in flames, was hauled back by his two older brothers. His legs and arms were burned, but though

still bandaged, he is making good recovery.

Chief Ide, crawling through dense smoke on hands and knees, phoned in the alarm which brought out 100 volunteer firemen from Lehman, Dallas, Trucksville, Shavertown, Jarveys Lake and Idetown. The house was completely gutted the blaze, cause unknown, started at the rear of the first floor.

The family escaped in night clothing, all possessions a total loss. So Bradley, soon to be married, lost his wedding clothes.

The family is staying with relatives, Mr. and Mrs. Russell Ide, in Meeker, until other living quarters can be arranged.

In a trailer next door to the Joseph Ide home, an older son, Roland, his wife and five children, awakened to intense heat and billowing smoke and rushed outdoors. Clothing will be collected for

the family by the Idetown Fire Company Auxiliary. Mrs. George Carpenter, Mrs. John Kaminsky, and Mrs. Lewis Lanning are in charge of collection.

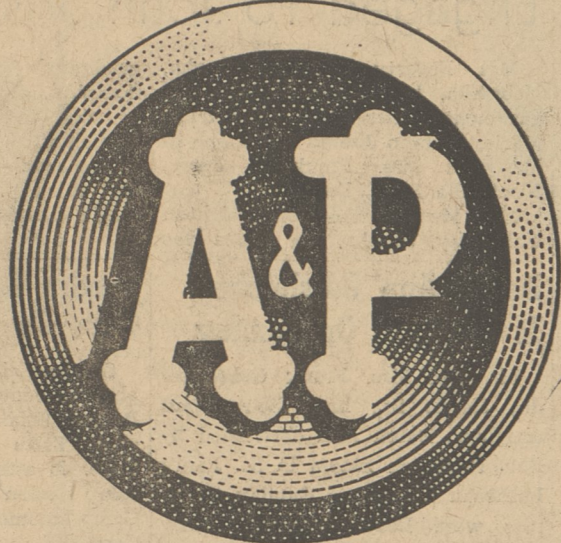
Poet's Corner
