Honor Scout Award

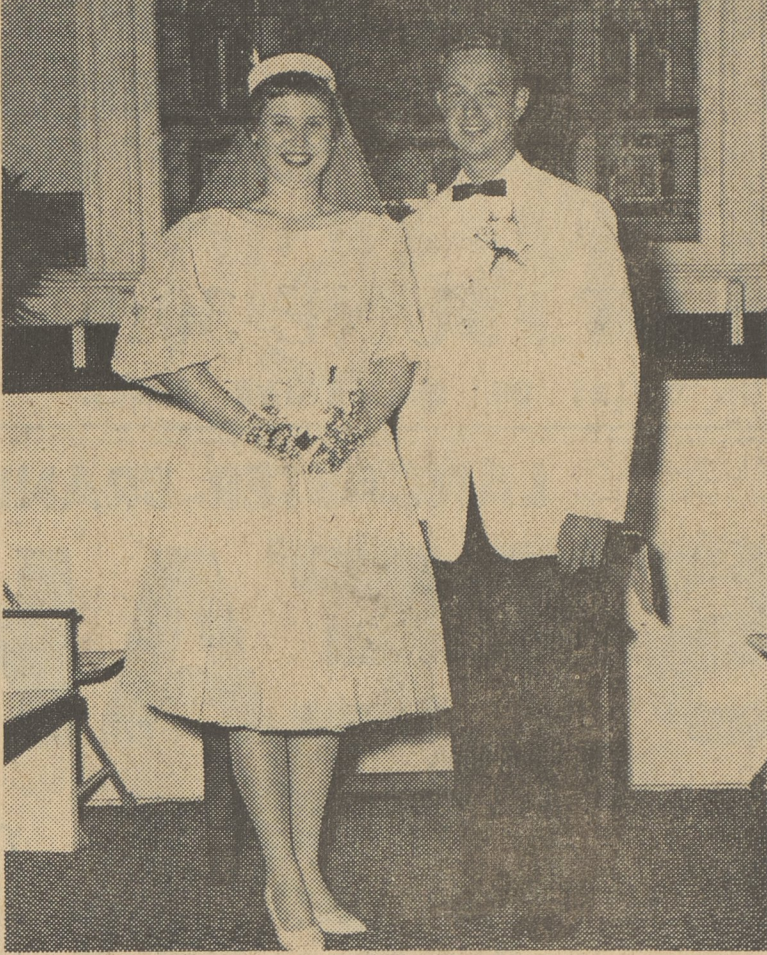
