Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Cook of 118 Boas Street, Harrisburg will observe their 10th wedding anniversary on Friday, June 29.

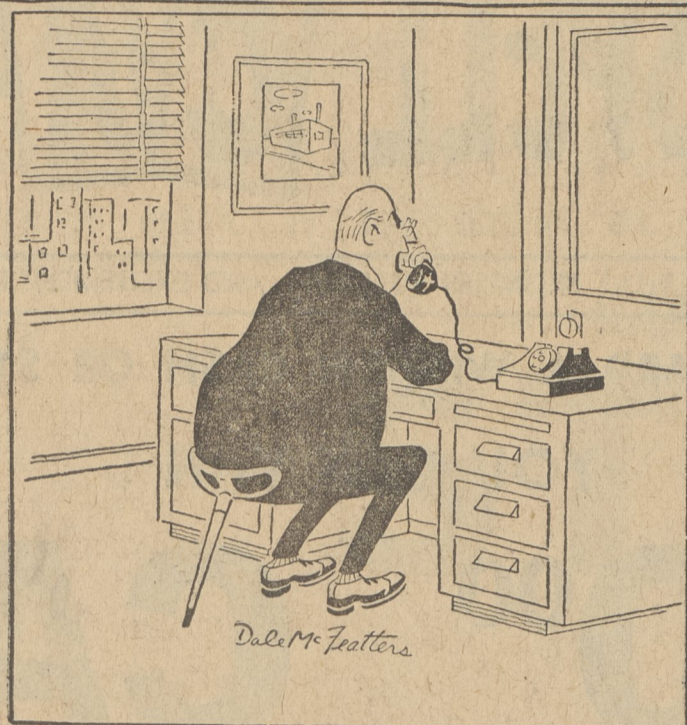
They were married in Trucksville Methodist Church by Rev. Robert T. Webster. Mrs. Cook is the former Ruth Bennett of Holly Street.
