It Takes Something More, Much More To Make Us What We Ought To Be!

As I read the papers it looks to me that the supreme court ruling in the case of the New York school prayers is just and right. It did not rule against praying! It ruled against the State or any local government's handing out a prayer and saying to the schools, "Here! Pray this prayer in your school. This one is all right to pray." I do not favor any local government telling anybody anybody what is a proper prayer to pray. If I had children in school I think I would teach them to say silent prayers under any and all circumstances. No legislative body can operate against that. As President Kennedy said in effect, "It is up to all of us to do more praying in our churches and in our homes. There is no law against that."

On the other hand I think no atheist parents should have got upset over their children having or being exposed to the New York State's model prayer for schools to use. I think that prayer would never keep anybody from growing up atheist! It didn't have a punch line! It takes a lot more than prayer and Bible reading in the public school to make a generation even mildly religious. My generation, which grew up in schools with prayer and Bible reading in them, is not packing the churches to overflowing! Yes, it takes something more, much more, to make us what we ought to be.

Newly Organized Lutheran Church In America Is Largest Lutheran Unit

Rev. Frederick Eidam, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Shavertown, states that six years of preparation has gone into the action taken week in Detroit for unification of Lutheran Churches into Lutheran Churches of America, a plan which affects over 3 million people and establishes the Lutheran Church of America as the largest of the Lutheran unifications.
 Combining are churches representing Germany, Swedish, Finnish, and American Evangelical congregations.

Methodist Progress Campaign Is Oversubscribed By \$48,904

Methodist Wyoming Conference Progress Crusade has exceeded its goal of \$1,346,361 by \$48,904. A total of \$1,395,265 has been raised in cash and pledges from 300 churches.
