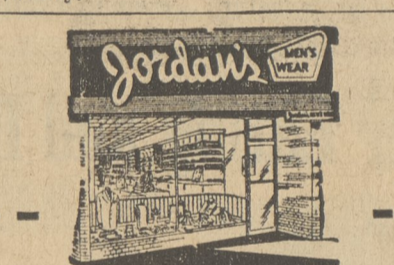
Jonathan R. Davis Fire Co. Plans Annual Festival
