Each night, free gifts will be awarded.

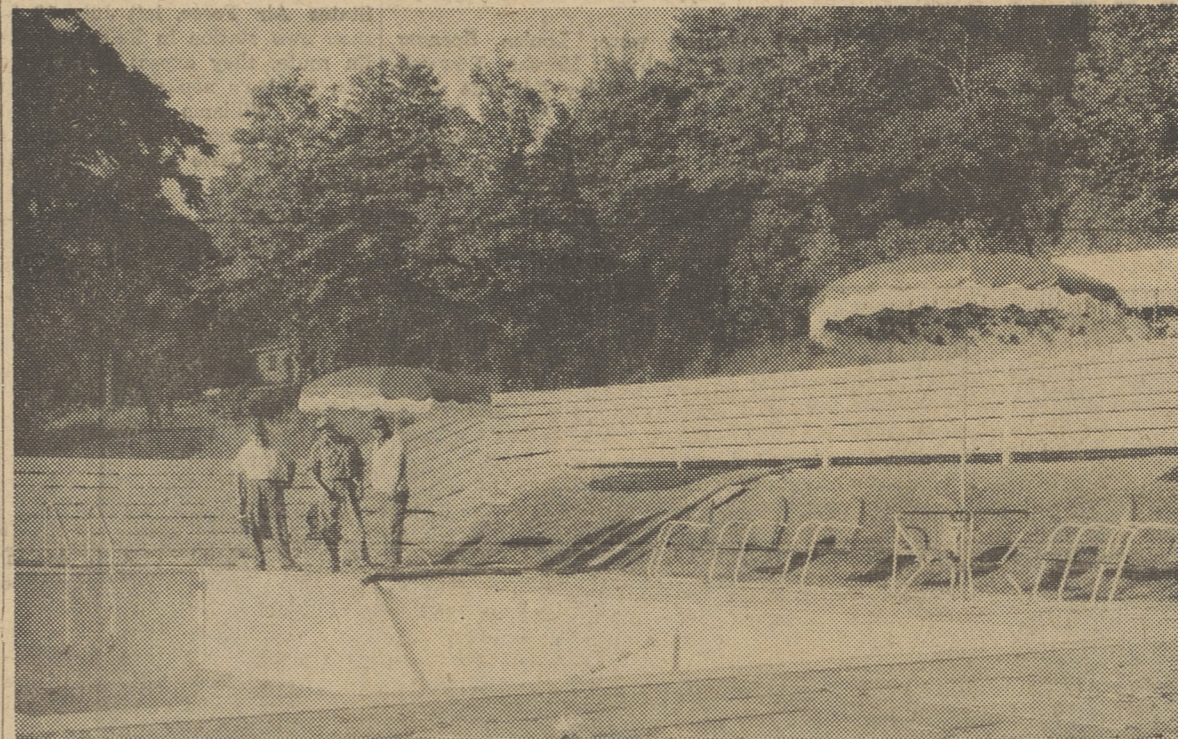

Construction began four weeks ago by George Ruckno, Inc., resulting in a structure approximately 20' X 40', with a 6,000 gallon capacity. Built of reinforced concrete, the pool is equipped with the latest in chlorination, filtering and vacuuming equipment. It is adjacent to the house, and both command an imposing view of the lake from the rise on which they are located.

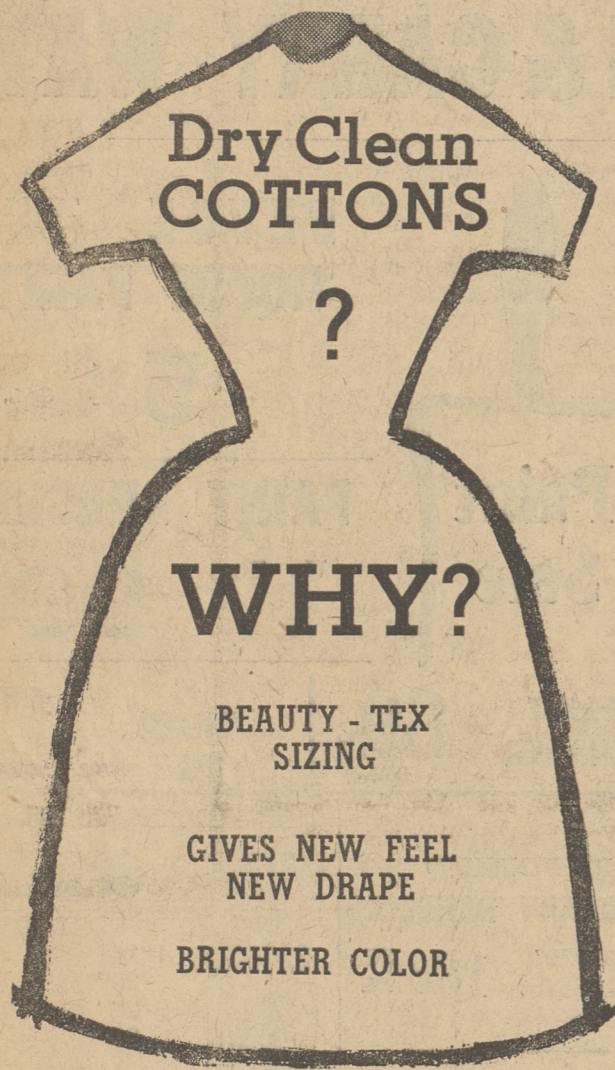

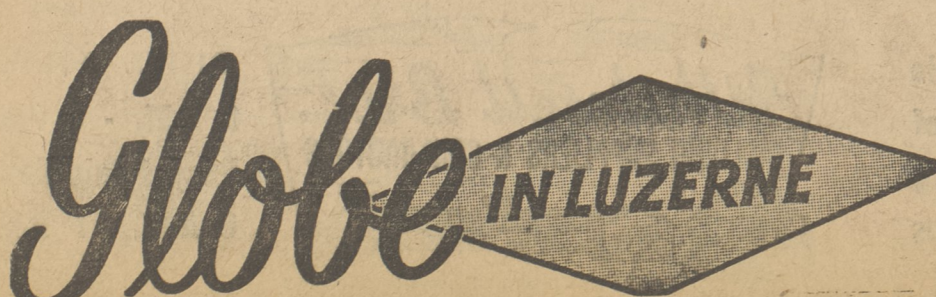
