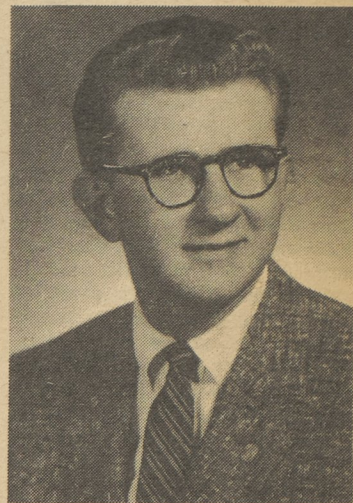


MRS. MARCY H. KERSHNER
