Horseshoe 4-H Club

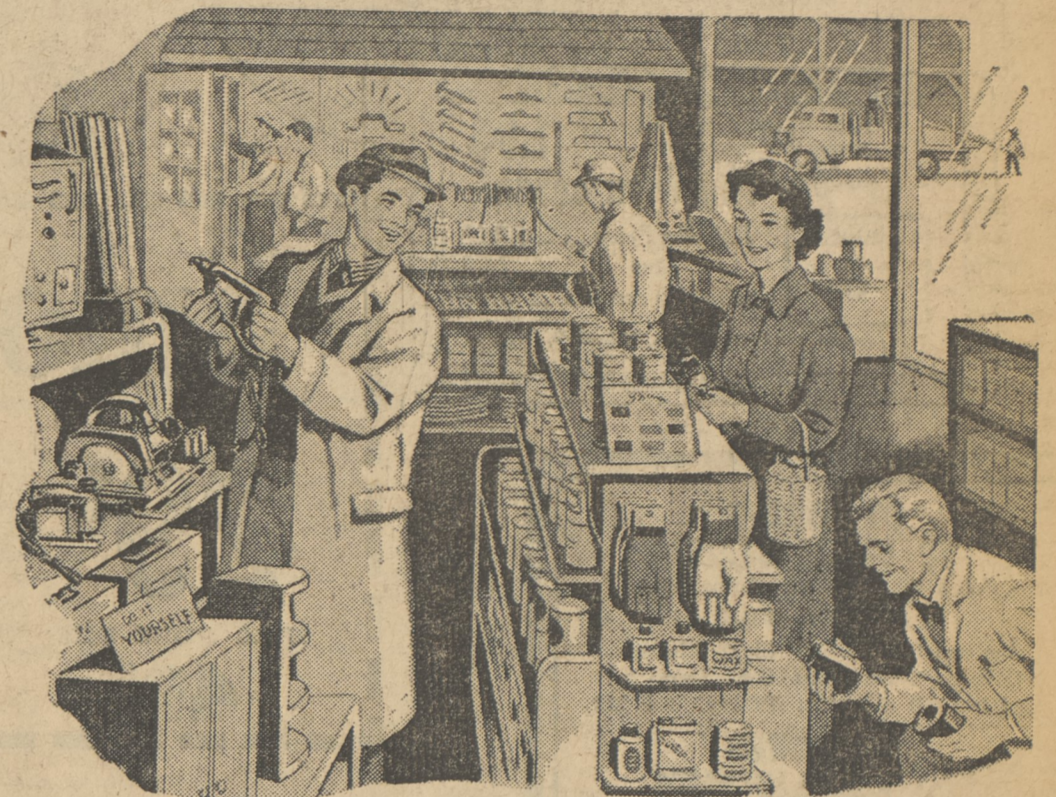

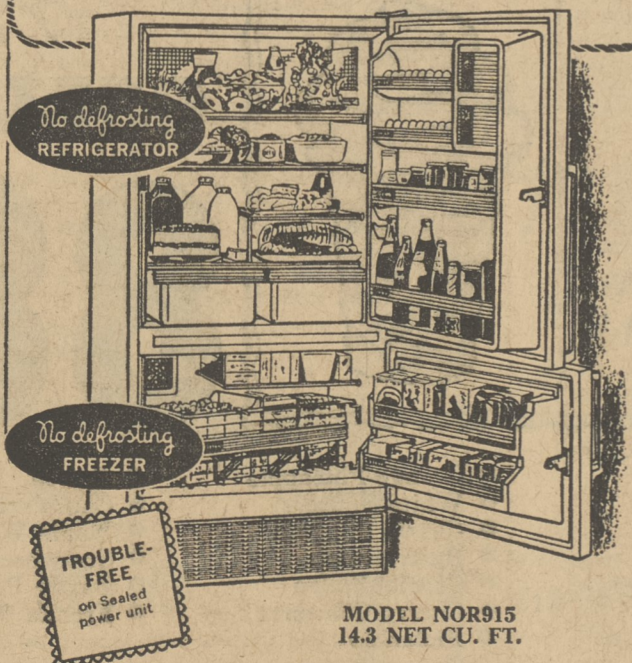
