The Hooper boys were frequent visitors in the Back Mountain Area and have many friends living here now.

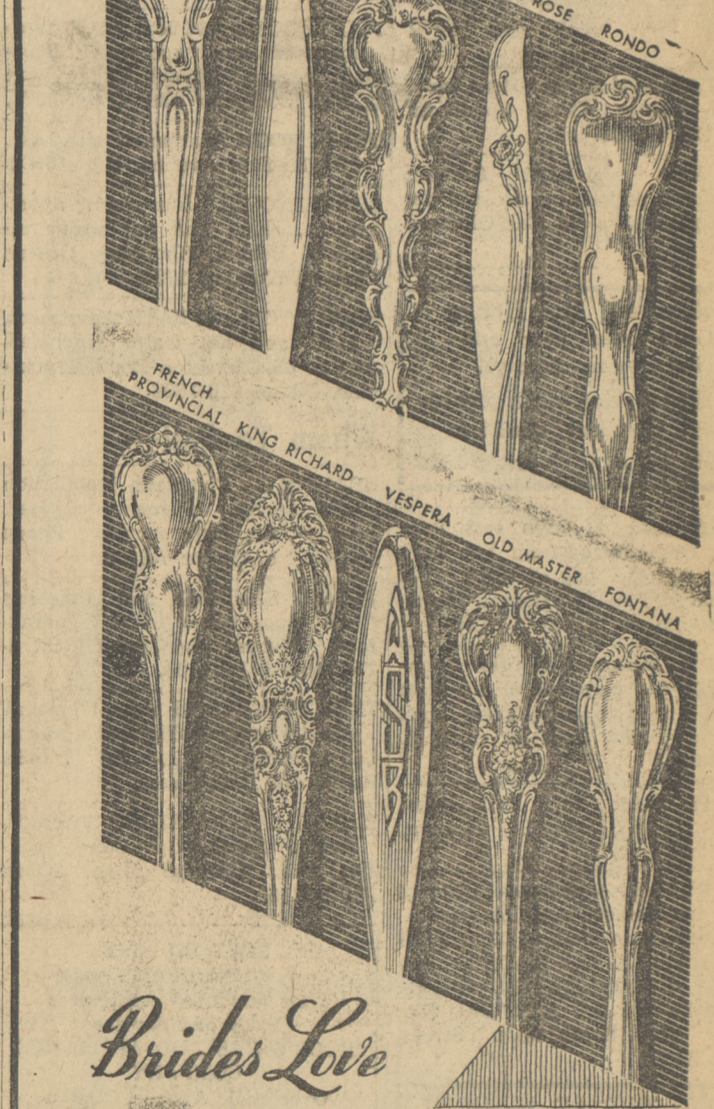
Quiet Weekend
