**Third Quarter Income Taxes Due Monday**

Taxpayers paying estimated income tax are, according to District Director Ellis R. Rogers of the in-

ternal Revenue Service office in Scranton, required to pay their third installment of tax due on 1962 estimated income by September 17, 1962.

If the income expected to be earned during 1962 has changed, taxpayers should file an amended declaration of estimated tax. A blank form for use as an amended return is printed on the back of the bill which taxpayers receive for an installment of estimated tax, Mr. Rogers pointed out.

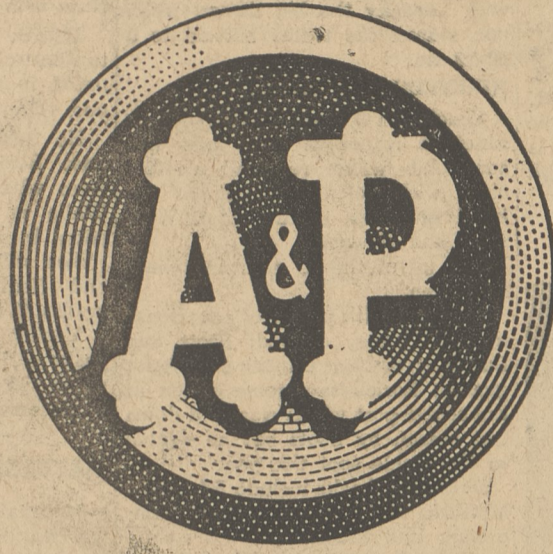
**Students Returning To Cedar Crest**
