Lake-Lehman Bus Pick-Ups

Lake-Lehman bus routes in Ross Township maintain the same schedule as last year.

Jackson Township schedule is the same, except for extension of Ralph Miers route by .7 of a mile to Dallas Township line, and Jack Graham route, Lake Silkworth, route 29.

Noxen: Noxen bus No. 8 will take junior high school students express to the new building, starting from Noxen elementary. Bus 7, for senior high students, starts at Noxen elementary picks up at Alderson and Warden Place.

Bus 5, Lehigh Valley trestle, route 29, south to Harveys Lake picnic grounds. Noxen high school students only.

Mr. Casterline's bus will pick up Stull students. A Joint Board bus will pick up elementary children on Route 29, to Noxen. Return home will be by joint board bus. Casterline's bus will return secondary students to Stull.

Lake Township: Interchanges at Loyallville, Kern's Restaurant, and Lake elementary will be used to transfer elementary and secondary students picked up en route. At Payne's Interchange, elementary pupils board Bus 1, secondary bus 3; at Kern's, elementary bus 2, secondary bus 4; at Lake, secondary take bus 5.

Lehman: Oak Hill, dual transportation. Bus 11 picks up elementary pupils for Lehman; returns for secondary students for the new high school.

Route 1: Route 29, Pikes Creek, corners, Swires Corners, Sweet Valley Highway to Boston's, Pikes Creek, left on 29, right to Klinetob Pond, to Payne's interchange; Bear Hollow road to Outlet; route 415 to Point Breeze, Sandy Beach, Lake building.

Route 2: Corner of Route 779, Meeker-Loyalville Road, Bryants Road, 29 to Klinetob Pond, right on 29 to Payne's Store interchange, left via Bear Hollow Road to Kern's; right on 415 to Sunset, around Harveys Lake to Lake building.

Route 3: Ruggles Methodist Church, route 29, south to Swire's-Gennetts, left on 680, left on Stone Quarry road, left on 415, left on 29, left on 750, right on 779 (Kupstas Store) to Payne's interchange; 118 via Loyalville-Meeker road to Lake-Lehman high school.

Route 4: Meeker Grange to Outlet Road, right on Outlet Lehman road to Lehman Township line, Kern's interchange, pick up high school, let off elementary students to take bus 2; return to Lehman elementary via Outlet Road, new high school via Cemetery Road.

Route 5: Start Noxen Trestle, south to Picnic Grounds, left at Hanson's to Alderson Methodist church; return to Lake elementary via route

375; leave Lake elementary, right to Point Breeze to Lake-Lehman high school via Outlet Road.

Route 6: Sandy Bottom to top of Sorber Mountain, return, go left on 29 to Renard's, right to Oney Corners, left to Lake building.

Route 7: Start Noxen elementary, south on 29 to Picnic Grounds, left via Idetown to 118, to new High School.

Route 8: Start Noxen elementary, south to Picnic Grounds, left at Hanson's Lake Highway to Sunset, left via Idetown to Route 118, Lake Lehman high school.

Route 9: Start Warden Place, left on Carpenter Road to Sgarlat Lake; turn around, left on 40060 to Idetown, left on old Harveys Lake highway, right on 42nd Street, left on 40060, to route 118, Lehman elementary, then new high school.

Route 10: Idetown Corners, left to Putterbaugh's, right on Route 415 to 42nd Street, right to Idetown Road, left on 40060, left to 118, right to Lehman elementary and high school.

Route 11: Lehman Township bus: Idetown Corners, right to Oak Drive via Oak Hill area to Hilltop Drive, right on Park, right on Vine, right on Laurel, right on Maple, right on Sunset Drive, right on Idetown Road to route 118, right to Lehman elementary.

Route 11-A: Idetown Corners, right to Hilltop Drive via Oak Drive, right on Park, right on Vine, right on Laurel, right on Maple, right on Sunset, right on Idetown Road, cross route 118 at the Sawmill, continue to Huntsville Nursery, right to Lake-Lehman school, then Lehman elementary.

Route 12: Start on 795, turn right at Huntsville Nursery, to Smith's Pond, right on 700, to old route 115, to new high school. Pick up elementary students from lobby for Lehman elementary.

Route 13: Start Jigger Jones Hotel, Lake Silkworth, left on 579, turn around, left on 29, right on 577 (Lizdas), left on 687 (Rood's), left on 204 (Hartman's) right on 29, left on 40060 (Ceasetown Road to Meeker) right on 118 to high school and elementary.

Route 14: Lehman Center, 40134 to 708 across route 118, continue on Cornell-Ceasetown Road, right on 581, left 29 to Pearl Street at Silkworth, turn around at Klanksek store via 29, right on 118 to high school, then elementary.

Time schedules and pickup will be announced.

Registration For Extension Courses September 17 and 18

Registration for adult evening extension classes offered by Dallas School District will be conducted September 17 and 18, at the Senior High School Cafeteria from 7 to 9 p. m.

The classes, subject to approval by the Board of School Directors, are scheduled to open on Monday, September 24, and close on Thursday, March 28.

Adults who did not complete their high school education may attend classes and satisfy requirements for graduation.

Classes will meet on Monday through to Thursday night on the nights designated starting at 7 with dismissal at 9:30.

Classes are scheduled to meet as follows: Art I — Water Color — Wednesday; Art II — Oil — Monday; Bookkeeping — Tuesday and Thursday; Business Machines — Wednesday; Consumer Economics — Wednesday; Contemporary Political Science (1945 to 1960) — Tuesday; Creative Writing — Tuesday;

Home Economics: Dressmaking I — Monday; Dressmaking II — Tuesday; Dressmaking III — Wednesday; Dressmaking IV — Thursday; Woodworking I — Monday; Woodworking II — Thursday; Mechanical Drawing — Tuesday;

Conversational Languages: German — Monday; French — Wednesday; Spanish — Thursday; Music: Mixed Chorus — Monday; Orchestra — Tuesday; Physical Education for women — Monday; Physical Education for men — Thursday; Public Speaking — Monday; Shorthand I — Monday & Thursday 7 to 8:10 p.m.; Shorthand II — Monday and Thursday 7 to 8:10 p.m. Speed Reading — Wednesday; Typing I — Monday and Thursday 8:15 to 9:30 p.m.; Typing II — Monday and Thursday 8:15 to 9:30 p.m.

The following subjects will be offered for high school credit, if sufficient students enroll: English I, II, III, IV — Tuesday and Thursday;

History—United States — Thursday; World Culture — Thursday; Pennsylvania — Thursday; Languages — French — Monday and Wednesday; Spanish — Monday and Wednesday;

Mathematics — Algebra I, II — Monday; Trigonometry — Monday;

Geometry — Monday; Plane Geometry — Monday; Solid Science — Biology, Chemistry, and Physics — Monday and Wednesday. Child Development: Offered on Monday night by John K. Thomas, Elementary Guidance Counselor for the Dallas School District. The course will cover the physical, emotional, and social growth of children from birth to adolescence. Special emphasis will be on the nature of intelligence and the learning process.

This course will be of interest to parents who have children in the elementary grades.

Classes will be scheduled if at least twenty persons enroll and the subject offering will be sponsored by the Board of School Directors.

Registration will be accepted for subjects not listed.
