Comparison Shopping Guide To Good Buys

Buying merchandise at discount houses may not always save you money, reminds Helen E. Bell, extension home management specialist, the Pennsylvania State University. Don't assume that prices are lower. Some appliance and department stores may sell merchandise at lower prices than discount houses in the same area.

Price comparison is your only guarantee of saving, and you should make this comparison on identical merchandise. Compare the same brand, serial number, model, and size. Try to price it at several

stores, including discount, specialty, and department. Miss Bell suggests. You must be aware that list price means little as all kinds of stores give discounts. You may be able to bargain at several stores.

Price isn't the only criteria for finding the best buy, Miss Bell adds. Be sure to check if installation and service, come with purchases requiring it. A discount house may or may not include these with the purchase although it does give the manufacturer's guarantee. This means you may be spending the amount saved on the purchase price for installing and servicing the appliance.
