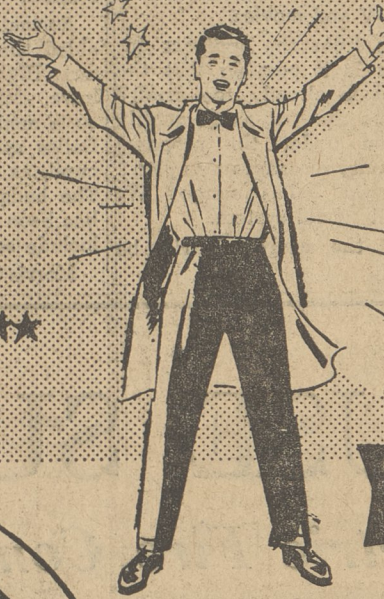
John Mokychie, East Dallas who has been a patient in General Hospital for several weeks returned home on Tuesday.

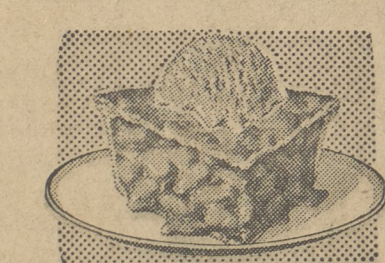
