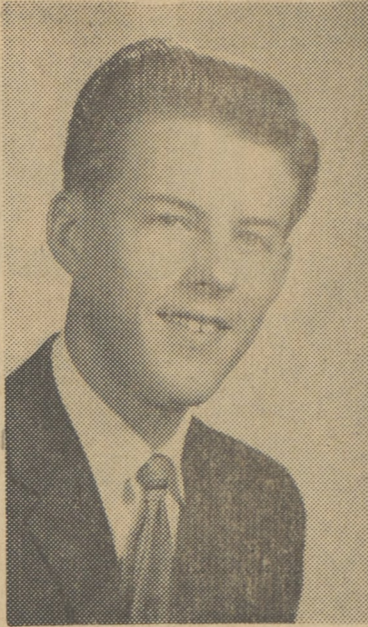

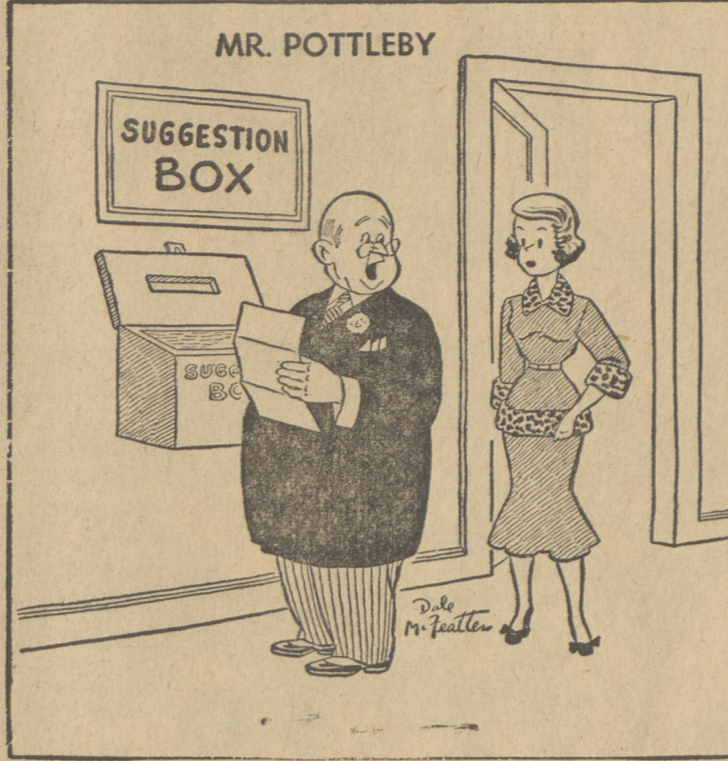
In writing to the Dallas Post, his mother says, "We still enjoy the Dallas Post after all these years away from Dallas. It's a fine newspaper."
