Grand Old Man Of Presbytery Dies In Florida

Dr. Ebenezer Flack Was Pastor Emeritus Of Kingston Church

Dr. Ebenezer Flack, the grand old man of the Presbyterian ministry, died Saturday morning at Daytona Beach, Florida.

some years ago, when well along in his eighties, they had said, "Isn't that just like Dr. Flack? He is irreplaceable."

The time came when he felt a warmer climate would be beneficial. With regret he left Goss Manor, where for years he had lived side by side with his son, Senator Harold Flack, before the younger generation moved across the highway to New Goss Manor.

With his daughter Henrietta, he moved to Florida. His wife, the former Sarah Hutchinson, died ten years ago.

The oldest living graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary, he had been in the Presbyterian ministry for 47 years, retiring in 1939. His last pastorate was that of Kingston Presbyterian Church, where he occupied the pulpit for nineteen years.

A native of Ulster, Northern Ireland, he was a graduate of Queen's University, Belfast, before coming to this country to enter Princeton Theological Seminary. Honors and high office in the Pennsylvania Synod were his due. He was moderator from 1910 to 1912.
