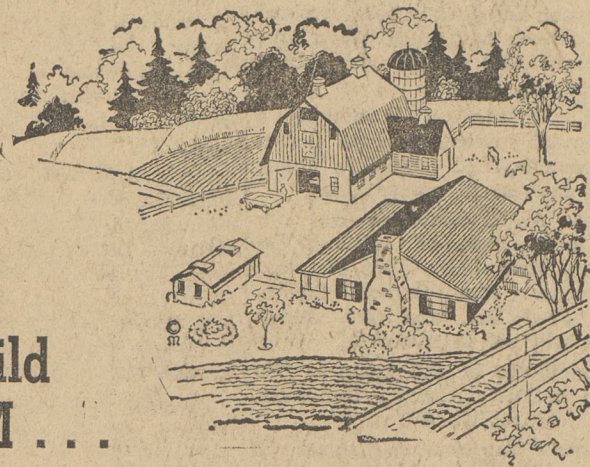

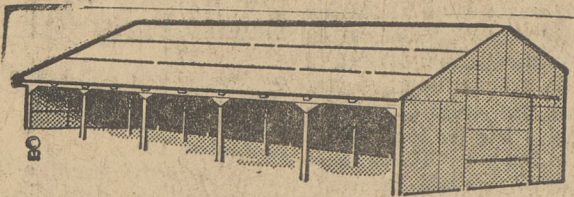
**Trucksville Scouts**

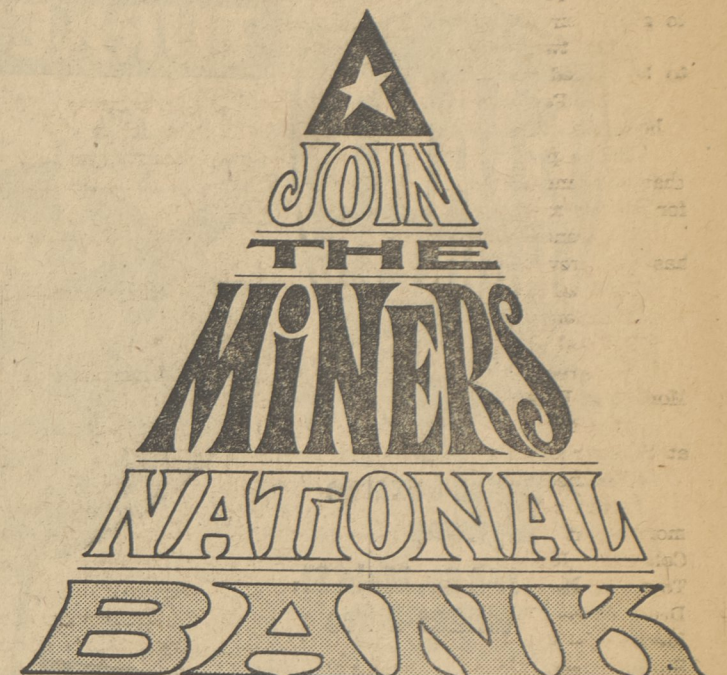

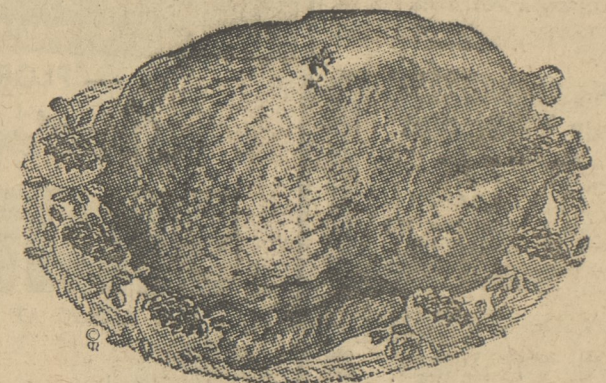
