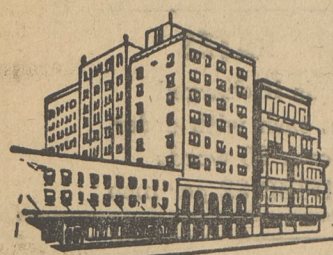

A garage and car were lost in a raging blaze on Old Lake Road, Idetown, Tuesday morning around 10:30, at the property of Howard Boyce.

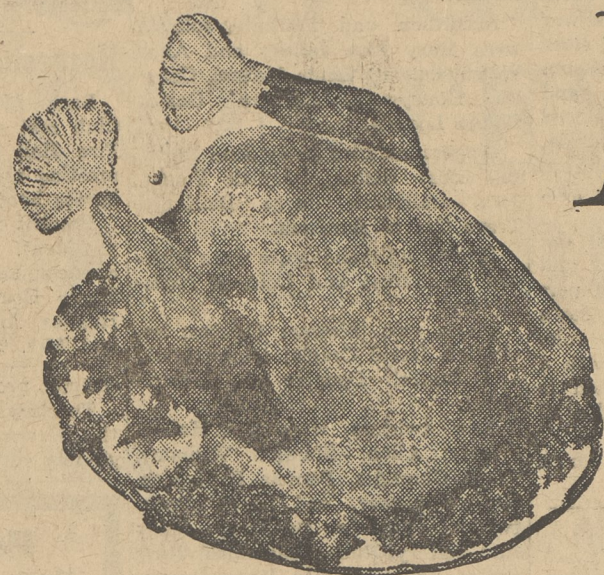
