

### Will Improve Local Roads

Catalpa, Mt. Zion Outlet Roads Slated

Extensive improvement of roads in the Back Mountain area has been projected by the Pennsylvania Department of Highways for next year, according to recent announcement.

Among many state legislative routes to be repaved, widened, or both are the notoriously dangerous Demunds-Kunkle Road, and various access routes to the River Route 92 in the Carverton, Orange, Mt. Zion area.

The following are sections of local roads slated for improvement, including Legislative route numbers, nature of work to be done, and costs estimated:

Lake Township: Outlet-Loyalville Road, Route 40115, 1.05 miles widening, resurfacing, new construction, cost \$47,921.25.

Lehman Township: Shawanese-Huntsville Road, Route 40060, 1.38 widening, resurface, new construction, \$73,521.

Dallas Township: Kunkle - Demunds Road, Route 40051, 1.38 miles widening, resurface, new construction, \$89,201.17. Upper Demunds Road, Route 40053, widening, resurface, \$110,000.

Kingston, Exeter Townships: Road from Carverton Road to Mt. Zion, Route 40052, 1.99 miles widening, resurface, new construction, \$151,383.15.

Kingston, Franklin, Exeter Townships: Carverton - Sutton's Creek Road, Route 40014, 3.17 miles widening, resurface, new construction, \$311,182.82.

Exeter Township: Mt. Zion-Exeter Boro, Route 40048, 2.35 miles new construction, \$310,308.60.

Hunlock Township: Hunlock Creek-Muhlenburg Highway, Route 935, Bridges and approaches. Also approved for next year is repaving of Main Street, Dallas, Route 936.

### Urges War On Jap Beetles

Japanese beetle infestation, little changed this year in Pennsylvania from 1961, may continue to hold its own unless intensive and concerted eradication measures can be adopted, Dr. Thomas L. Guyton, director of the Bureau of Plant Industry, State Department of Agriculture has said.

The beetles winter in the grub stage in the ground, feeding on grass roots in the fall and spring. They change to beetles in early summer, emerging as golden green, hard shelled adults, ready to devour roses and other flowers and
