## Three Jailed For Burglary Police Recover Bulk Of Truckville Loot

State police have recovered most of the sporting equipment and jewelry stolen from a Truckville home October 25, although a safe, emptied of valuables, still lies at the bottom of the Susquehanna River.

The three men charged with the burglary were committed to the county prison Saturday following a hearing before Alderman Francis Murphy, Wilkes-Barre.

They were arrested Friday after extensive investigation by officers from Wyoming Barracks.

Owner C. William Bertels, Huntsville-Hillside Road, notes that the daylight thieves, Raymond Miller, 21, Ashley, Ralph Garrity, 22, and Julius Donald Rowles, 21, Wilkes-Barre, moved fast.

All were temporary cab-drivers for Crane Taxi Company which was on strike at that time, and somehow knew the four or five days in which the large estate would be unattended.

They gained entrance by prying open a porch door, and made off with nine guns, a pair of binoculars, two cameras, and some liquor, in addition to the safe which contained jewelry.

There are no close neighbors, according to Bertels, and there are several houses on the grounds, so the burglars did not fear being seen.

Garrity had planned to be married Saturday morning, but had to postpone the wedding.

Jackson Township Police Chief Robert Cooper was also consulted in the case.

## Head-On Crash Injures Three Drivers Disagree On Right Of Way

Two Dallas drivers are in disagreement as to who was at fault in an accident at the "Y" in Truckville early Friday morning, in which three were injured, two hospitalized.

Marvin L. Stuart, 21, 16 Poplar Street, proceeding north from the highway on to Pioneer Avenue, collided with Frederick W. Newman, Jr., 21, New Goss Manor, who was traveling toward Luzerne on the highway.

Right of way at that intersection depends chiefly on how much progress one driver has made before the approach of the other becomes evident.

Each driver claims to have been partially through the intersection at the time the vehicles clashed left front fenders.

Hospitalized with Stuart was a passenger, David Crisman, 20, Hillside Road, Truckville, suffering back and leg injuries. Stuart had a bad cut in the forehead, but was released Sunday.

Newman complained of a bump on the head, and consulted his family physician.

Stuart and Crisman were taken to Nesbitt Hospital in Kingston Township ambulance, manned by William Pugh, Marvin Yeust, and William Frederick.
