Clark Mosier And Bill Moore Pacing Susquehanna Quintet

Senior Clark Mosier and Bill Moore are the early-season statistical leaders on Susquehanna University's basketball team.

Mosier, a 6' 2" guard from Dallas is pacing the Crusaders in scoring with an average of 17.3 points per game and Moore, 6-5 forward from Shamokin, leads the way in rebounding with an average of 10.3 recoveries per contest.

This should surprise virtually no one since the same pair led the team in these categories last year. Mosier's average, however, is well below the 28.3 points per game he jammed through the nets last season. The Dallas hotshot was bothered by pulled muscles in S. U.'s first two games, when he scored only six points against Fairleigh Dickinson and 10 against Temple.

Mosier recovered his shooting eye and pumped in 39 points against

Catholic University, but he could manage only 14 in last Saturday's low-scoring (37-19) victory over Ursinus' Grizzlies. Ursinus, trying to control the ball and take only "sure" shots, kept possession for minutes at a time without shooting, but the strategy failed.

Beaten only by Temple, Susquehanna will seek its fourth victory tonight when the Crusaders journey to Wilkes-Barre to take on Wilkes College at 8:15 p.m.

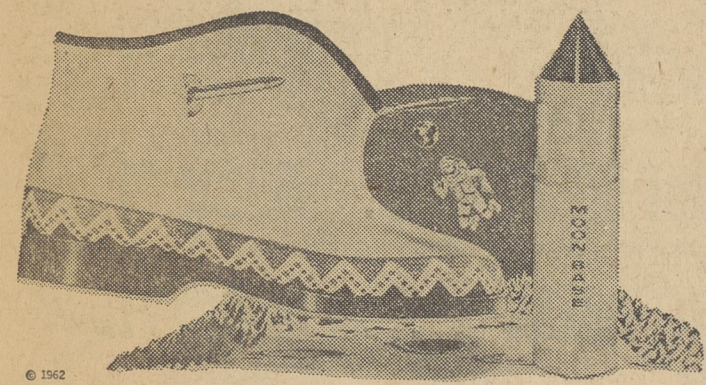
