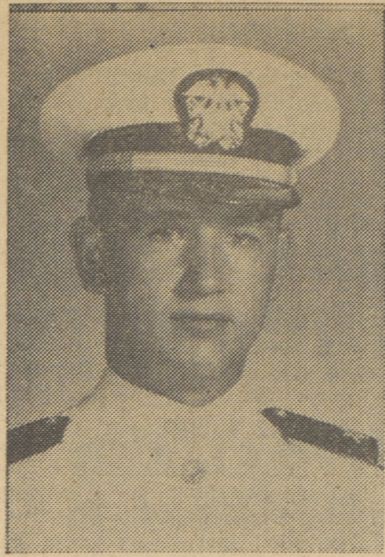

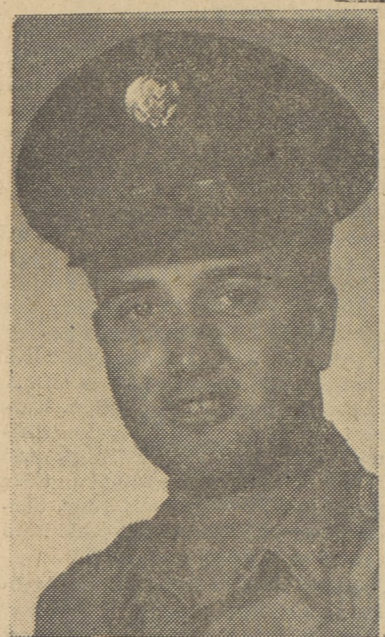
Gets Commission

Many Deer Killed

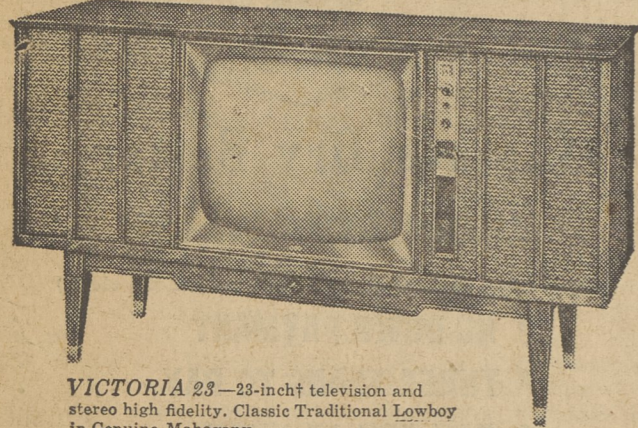
During October more than 1600 Pennsylvania deer were accidentally killed on highways, illegally taken by outlaws, or deliberately shot to prevent additional crop damage.

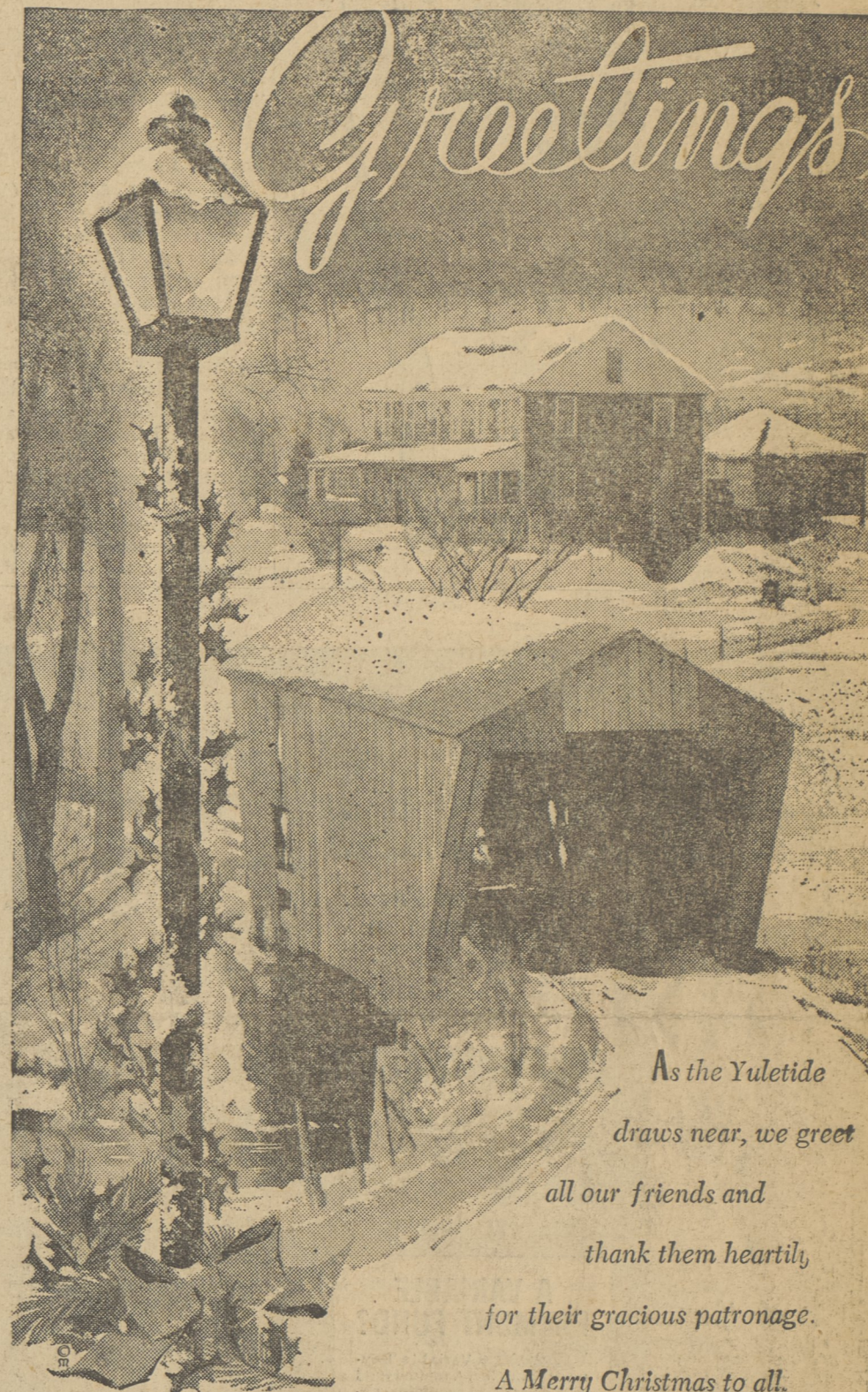
