The following ordinance will be acted upon at a meeting of the Kingston Township Board of Supervisors to be held in the Kingston Township Building on January 7, 1963, at 8 P. M.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AS TOWNSHIP ROADS CERTAIN ROADS IN KINGSTON TOWNSHIP, LAYING OUT AND OPENING THE SAME AS PUBLIC ROADS OF SAID TOWNSHIP BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Supervisors of Kingston Township at a regular meeting assembled and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same: Section 1 of the Ordinance passed November 28, 1961, be and the same hereby is amended as follows: (1) By striking out therefrom that portion of said Ordinance designated in "Section 1(a) Terrace Avenue and substituting therefore the following: (a) TERRACE AVENUE: BEGINNING at a point on the center line of the present Terrace Avenue, said point being at the intersection of the property line common to B. C. Banks and lands known as Trucksville Gardens with the aforesaid center line of Terrace Avenue; THENCE continuing in a Northeasterly direction, on a sixteen (16) degree curve to the right with a radius of three hundred

fifty nine and twenty six one hundredths (359.26) feet for a distance of one hundred eighty and sixty two one-hundredths (180.62) feet to a point; THENCE North seventy six (76) degrees eighteen (18) minutes East, 0.78 feet to a point; THENCE continuing in a Northeasterly direction, on a fifteen (15) degree curve to the left with a radius of three hundred eighty three and six one-hundredths (383.06) feet, for a distance of one hundred ninety two and sixty seven one-hundredths (192.67) feet to a point; THENCE continuing through lands of B. C. Banks, North forty seven (47) degrees twenty four (24) minutes East, six hundred twenty five and ninety three one-hundredths (625.93) feet to a point; THENCE continuing through lands of B. C. Banks and the Luzerne County Housing Authority, North forty eight (48) degrees twenty four (24) minutes East, five hundred (500) feet to a point; THENCE continuing through lands of B.C. Banks and Joseph Blazes, North forty seven (47) degrees twenty four (24) minutes East, one thousand six hundred fifty four (1,654) feet to an intersection with the county road known as Bunker Hill Road. The above described right of way is 40 feet wide with an improved roadway, 18 feet wide, throughout the length.

The proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized to advertise this Ordinance and to do such other things as are necessary to be done in accordance with the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided.

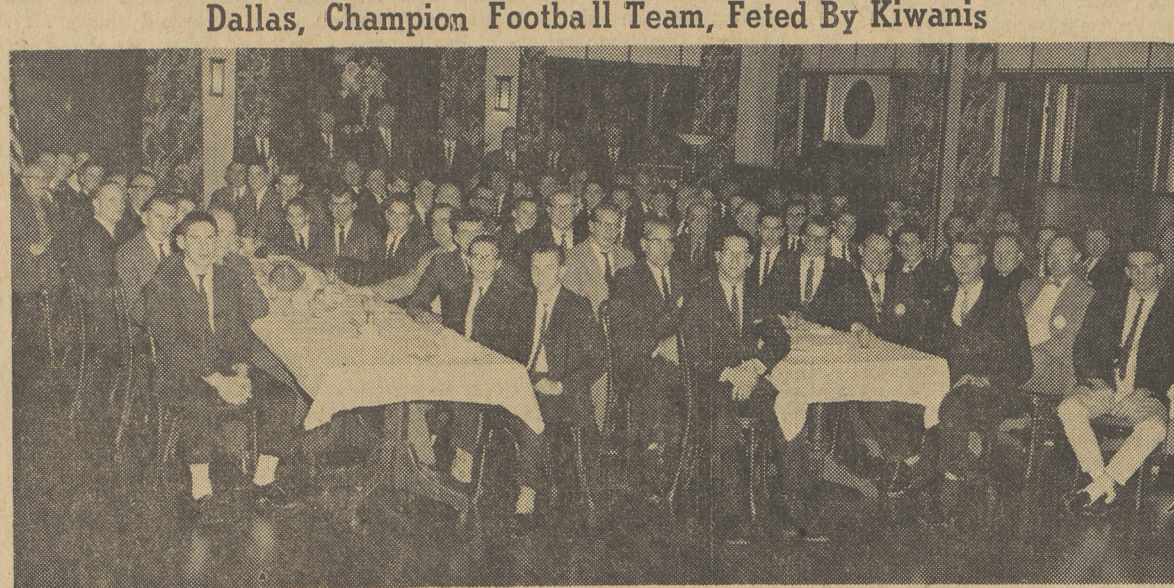

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AS TOWNSHIP ROADS CERTAIN ROADS IN KINGSTON TOWNSHIP, LAYING OUT AND OPENING THE SAME AS PUBLIC ROADS OF SAID TOWNSHIP BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Supervisors of Kingston Township at a regular meeting assembled and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same: SECTION 1: That the following described roads situate in Kingston Township all being, in the considered judgment of the Supervisors of said Township, necessary for the public convenience, are hereby laid out, adopted and opened as public roads of said Township, as follows: (a) FRANGORMA DRIVE: ALL THAT PARCEL of land, being thirty-three (33) feet in width and sixteen hundred thirty one and 5/100 (1631.5) feet, more or less, in length, improved with a macadam road, the center line of which is described as follows: BEGINNING at a point, said point being the Easterly line of the intersection of Frangorma Drive and West Hillside Street in Trucksville, Kingston Township, as shown on plot of lots known as Westmoreland Hills; THENCE North forty six (46) degrees fifty two (52) minutes East seven hundred three and 5/10 (703.5) feet, more or less, to a point; THENCE South twenty seven (27) degrees twenty two (22) minutes East two hundred forty three and 5/10 (243.5) feet, more or less, to a point; THENCE North forty six (46) degrees fifty two (52) minutes East six hundred thirty one and 5/10 (603.5) feet, more or less, to a point.

Watershed Laboratory
Operated By University

One of the few college-owned outdoor laboratories dealing with forest watershed management is operated by School of Forestry.

Studies of water relationships are underway on three experimental watersheds. Located on the south side of Tussey Mountain near Mansbury, Huntingdon County.

Three additional stream-gaging stations were established in 1961 on low lying watersheds in Huntingdon County. Cooperating on all arrangements are the Pennsylvania Department of Forests and Waters, Harrisburg, and the Northeastern Forest Experiment Station, U. S. Forest Service, Upper Darby.

Project leader William E. Sopper says studies concern the effects of forests and forestry practices on water yield, water quality, and stream flow behavior.
