FARM CALENDAR

Protect Livestock — Keep livestock out of fields where there is frosted sudan grass or sorghum, warns Dr. Sam Guss, Penn State extension veterinarian. A few mouthfuls of this frosted forage can kill cows. When the plants are frosted, deadly poisons are formed. In case of poisoning, early treatment is a must. The same thing applies if your animals should eat wild cherry or choke cherry leaves which are frost damaged.

Exercise Cows — Cows need exercise even in winter, says Harvey E. Shaffer, dairy specialist. An exercise lot convenient to the barn is recommended.

Hunting License Is Permit — Game is a public resource and belongs to everyone, but land ownership is private, Robert G. Wingard, Penn State extension wildlife specialist, explains. A hunting license is merely a permit to take game under certain regulations; it does not grant the right to trespass on or abuse private property.

Propagation Course Offered — Propagation is gardening's fine art.




