Cries Of Livestock Point To Tragedy

Cries of distress from livestock on a Windgap farm on New Years morning led to the grim discovery that Rowland C. Shelley, 62, father of Arthur Shelley of Fernbrook, had suffered a heart attack during bitter weather Sunday night, and had collapsed beside his car in the frozen drifts.

Sheep and poultry had been without food or attention for two days. Area police arranged for their care immediately.

Mr. Shelley lived alone on his farm. Dressed warmly against sub-zero weather, he had apparently gone out to start his car Sunday night. Coroner's decision was that death occurred before he had frozen.

Richard Disque drove down to Windgap to bring back the body the day after its discovery.

Funeral services were conducted Friday afternoon by Rev. Russell Lawry, combined with committal services, access to Memorial Shrine cemetery being blocked by deep drifts.
