Trucksville Free Methodists Study Plans For New Edifice

Despite foul weather and slippery roads Saturday night, Trucksville Free Methodists gathered to make their pledges to the new church effort, meeting at a fellowship supper at Trucksville Fire Hall.

Rev. Grove Armstrong, reported 49 present, and \$5,750 in pledges made, including one for \$1,000.

The architect's drawing of the new church was unveiled. Plans are to construct in successive stages, as congregational expansion takes place and funds become available.

The location chosen for the new church is on Carverton Road, at intersection with the upper road leading to Luzerne, on a high and slightly plot of ground belonging to Burdette Crane. The site is one which Rev. Armstrong has had in mind for some years. Enough acreage will be obtained to provide room for a ranch style parsonage as well as a church edifice, with plenty of space for expansion and youth activities.

South African Minister To Speak At Shavertown

A Methodist Minister from South Africa, who has been a chaplain to thousands of gold-miners and now is studying in the United States, will speak at Shavertown Methodist Church Sunday Morning and at the Family Night Supper at 5:00 P.M. in the Social Rooms.

Reverend Robert G. H. Kelly, whose home is Capetown, is working toward a doctor of philosophy degree at Union Theological Seminary in New York.

For a year, Mr. Kelly was a chaplain to miners in the gold-fields of the Orange Free State, South Africa. His primary responsibility was to attend to the pastoral needs of white miners, but he worked with the African chaplain in ministering to African miners. About 30,000 miners are employed in the gold fields.

Born in Capetown, Mr. Kelly attended University of Capetown; Rhodes University in South Africa, where he received the bachelor of arts degree, and Cambridge University in England, where he received his M.A. He is a minister in the Methodist Church of South Africa.

Mrs. Emma Mancini Buried In Scranton
