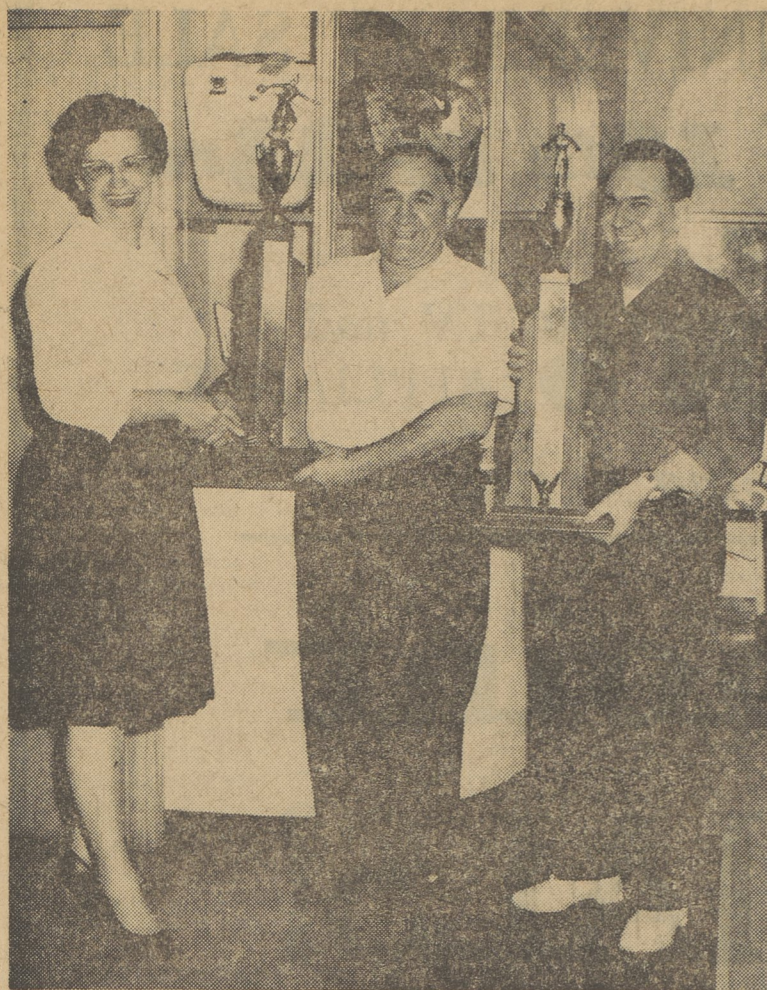


Crown Imperial House Champions
