AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE LAYING OF PIPES, WATER MAINS, GAS MAINS AND SERVICE MAINS IN AND LEADING FROM STREETS IN KINGSTON TOWNSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAIN-ED by the Supervisors of Kingston Township, in regular meeting assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the

SECTION 1: No water mains, gas kitchen furniture, odd chairs etc. mains or other pipes or mains shall George Mason, Kunkle, opposite be laid in any of the streets, roads Shady Side Lake. Phone 674-9521. or alleys of Kingston Township at a depth less than thirty (30) inches of books from each center is also from the surface of such street, road

> SECTION 2: No service lines, in or leading from the principal water mains, gas mains or other pipes shall, leading therefrom, be laid at a depth less than twenty four (24) inches from the surface of such streets, roads or alleys.

depth shall be measured from the surface of the ground, street, road or alley to the top of said water main, gas main, service main or

other pipe SECTION 4: Before any excavaion shall be made or work done in connection with the laying of such water mains, gas mains, service lines or other pipes, a permit therefor shall be secured as prescribed in other pertinent regula-

SECTION 5: All shut-off valves on water mains, service lines and other pipes shall be installed at a point outside the street or highway right of way line.

SECTION 9: The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any of the provisions thereof shall be held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional, the decision of the Court so holding shall not effect or impair any of the remaining provisions thereof it being hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional provision had not been included therein.
