**Snowblower Advice Given By Chaplain**

Charles Gilbert, ubiquitous Methodist chaplain from Mt. Zion and friend to everyone in the area, has proffered his homemade recipe for snowblower chains to anyone who can dig himself out of the door to the garage.

Once again, the chaplain has proven that he only pretends to be retired. Says Mr. Gilbert:

Every snow machine ought to come equipped with tire chains or suitable deep tread. After all the only time you use your snow machine is in snowy weather!

You can make the side chains out of dog chain material bought by the foot at a hardware store. Worn out cross chains which you have taken off your car, have enough wear left in them for your snow machine. All you need is two or three links for each cross chain.

But don't try sawing them off the rest of the chain with a hack saw. They are hardened steel, and the saw will not scratch them. Grind them off on your carborundum wheel. Then attach them to the side chains with monkey links. Fasten the ends of the completed chains with same monkey links.

There you have chains that will make your power machine really take hold of the snow and ice. They will not wear out as your car chains do because they will not scrape much on concrete paves.

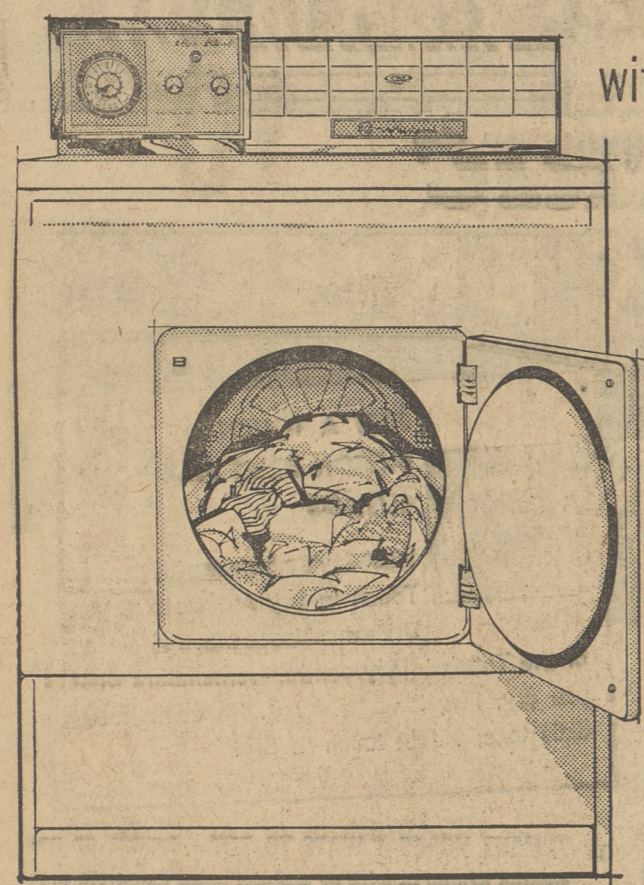

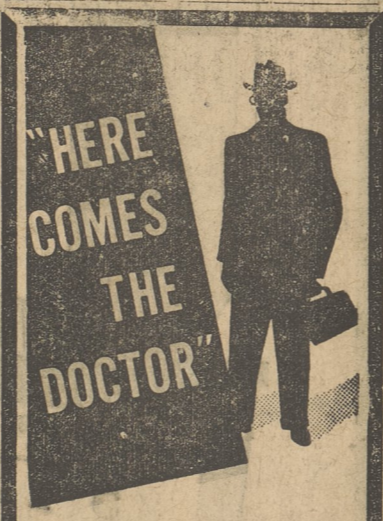
