Representing the Dallas Post at the Pennsylvania Newspapermen's Association Display Advertising Conference, Harrisburg, this weekend, was Edington Scott.

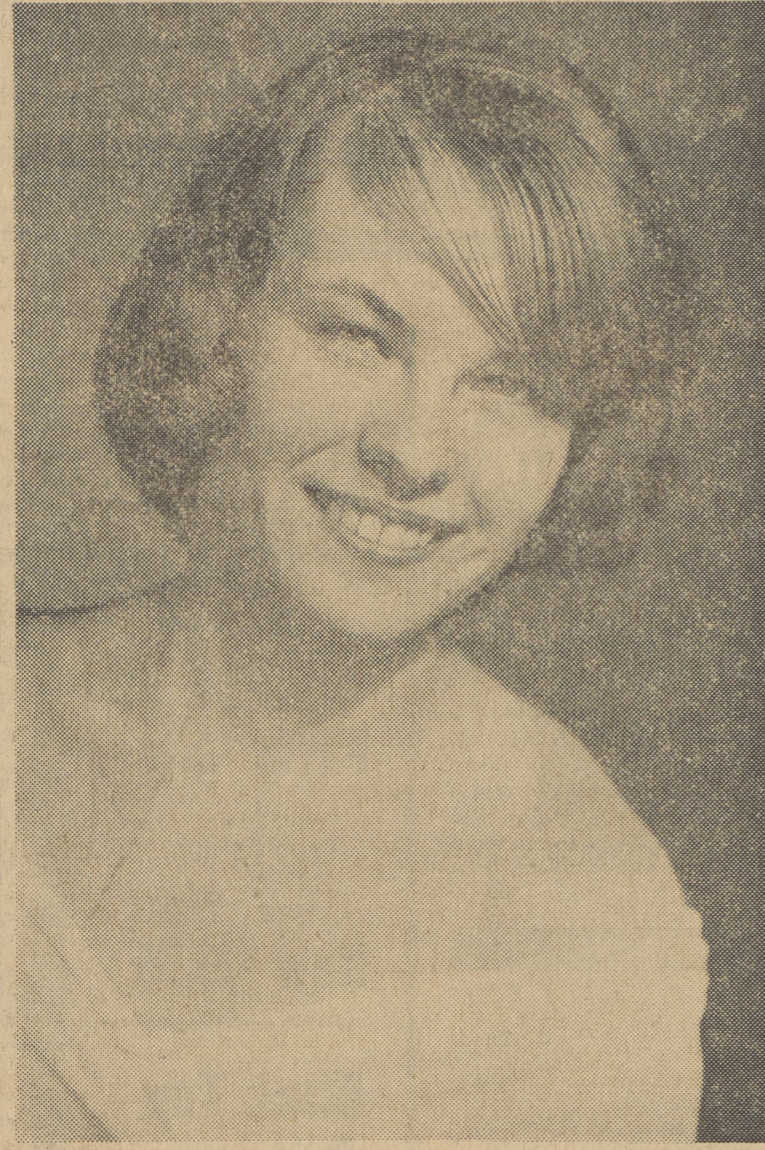
Dr. Aaron S. Lisses attended a two-part optometric educational seminar in Harrisburg Sunday.
