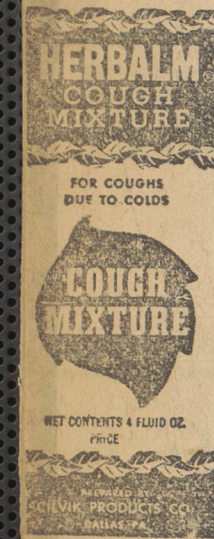


Charles Malkemes Heads Fraternity
