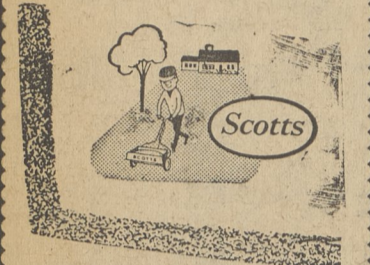
## Shavertown

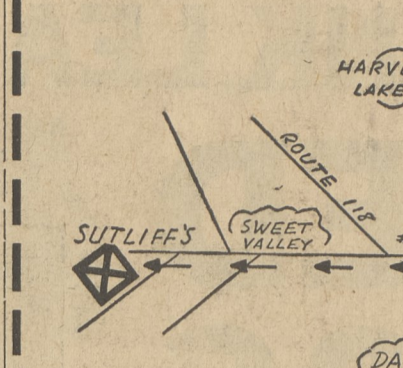

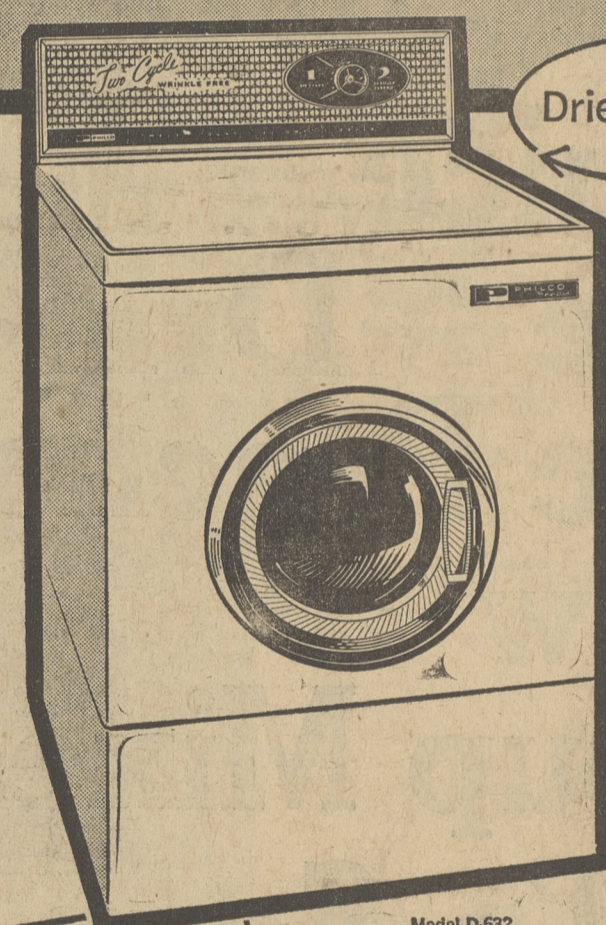

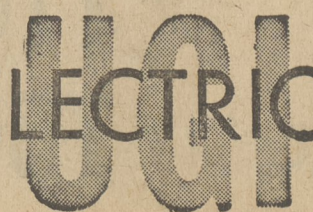
