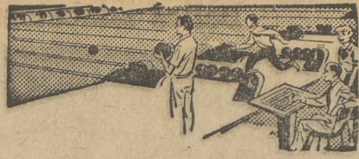
Sportsmen Bar won 3 from Dallas Lions with Frank Biologowicz rolling 204 (556). Lions had Dick Myers 201 (568).

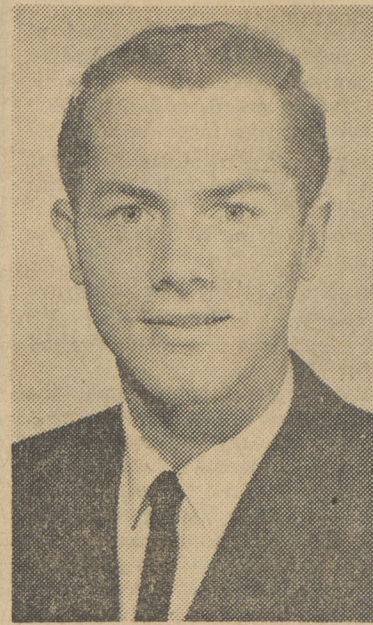
Code's S/S took 3 from Klass Motors with Code Besteder topping 205 (526), G. Smith hitting 203 (531) and J. Elston, 202.

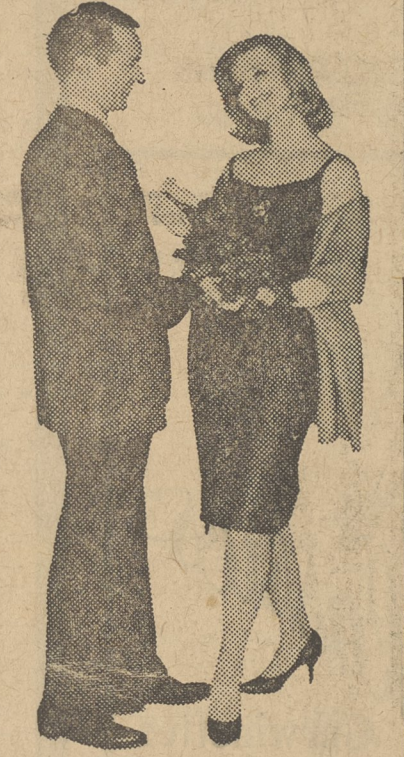
