**Locally-Owned Cow Gains National Note**

Owned by Raymond Goeringer, Lake Louise Farm, and bred by John S. Fine, Loyalsville, Eighty Acre's King's Bessie, junior three-year-old registered Guernsey has achieved outstanding national distinction.  
According to American Guernsey Club figures, Bessie completed a new record placing second in fat and tenth in milk production among the ten highest cows in her class. She produced 15,200 pounds of milk and 851 pounds of fat in 305 days, two times milking.  
This purebred cow was bred for production. "Bessie" was classified Very Good for type. Her dam, Western Glow Fame's Bella, has records of 12,710 pounds of milk and 597 pounds of fat, made as a nine year-old, in the Dairy Herd Improvement Register, in the 305-2X division; 11,442 pounds of milk and 573 pounds of fat, made as a six year-old, in the Herd Improvement Register, in the 305-2X division; 11,310 pounds of milk and 556 pounds of fat, made as a seven year-old, in the Herd Improvement Register in the 305-2X division; 11,340 and 540 pounds of fat, made as an eight year-old, in the Dairy Herd Improvement Register, in the 305-2X division; 10,353 pounds of milk and 503 pounds of fat, made as a junior three year-old, in the 305-2X division and met calving requirements and 10,035 pounds of milk and 502 pounds of fat, made as a junior two year-old, in the 305-2X division. "Bessie" was sired by Eighty Acre's Coronation King.

New Glass Yarn—Something new in glass yarns is a yarn that can be knitted and processed in ways never before possible with glass yarns, reports Bernice Tharp, Penn State extension clothing specialist. Beta, the new yarn, is used for slipcovers, upholstery, swimwear, and outdoor. Its diameter is half that of present glass filaments. This fine filament yarn is supple, soft, and has good flex strength. It is claimed to be resistant to abrasion and to have good dimensional stability. Potential uses seen for the new glass fiber are in blends of natural and manmade fibers.
