Marine Notes . . .

Look Ma, no noise. Don't listen now, but the sound you may not hear next summer will be that of an outboard motor — muted and muffled.

If you are happiest with the racket of a cranky old motor drowning out all the other sounds of summer, you've got a tin ear according to the manufacturers, and you're in for a dull season.

The manufacturers also will quickly remind you that their motors aren't cranky anymore, and not nearly so noisy.

Once upon a time SILENCE PLEASE was considered the private property of public libraries and hospital zones. Not anymore, it seems to have worked its way into the hearts (and advertising slogans) of the outboard motor people.

In fact, if the motor makers have their way, and there is every reason to believe that they will, outboarding may become the most silent sport since mah jong played on a blanket.

Perhaps this emphasis on silence is being exaggerated slightly here — but only slightly. A hefty stack of press releases on the 1963 crop of outboards give evidence that the motor manufacturers mean business; quiet business. Although silence is not the headline feature in any of these releases, it is the one feature common to all of them.

Listen, if you will, to just a few phrases dug out of the stack at random. "Balanced manifold system for minimum air intake sound; better insulation; jet prop exhaust that fires gases through the prop hub for quieter operation." (Mercury).

"Neoprene suspension, acoustical leg chamber." (West Bend).

"Powerheads isolated on rubber mounts; quiet high spiral gears; sound deadening fiber glass shrouds; air intake to eliminate whine." (Evinrude).
