

Mrs. Millie Woolbert Lies At Cedar Crest

Mrs. Millie Woolbert, 84, lifelong resident of Kingston Township, and last remaining sister of three girls born to the late Asa and Ann Prutzman Anderson, died early Monday morning at Chestnut Hill Hospital in Philadelphia, where she had been admitted for surgery a week earlier. She had rallied from a necessary operation, and had seemed to be

making progress. For fifty years she had been a member of Trucksville Methodist Church and active in its organizations, the WSCS, the Reynolds Class, and the Service Mothers Club. Her husband Archie, with whom she observed her Golden Wedding ten years ago, died in 1956 after retiring from the grocery business in Trucksville. A few months ago, Mrs. Woolbert, in need of nursing care, went to Philadelphia to live with her son Willard. The sister with whom she was the most intimate, Mrs. Charles Reese, for many years lived within a stone's throw of Mrs. Woolbert. Surviving are three sons: William and Kenneth, Trucksville, Willard, Philadelphia; four grandchildren. She was buried at Cedar Crest yesterday afternoon, following services conducted by Rev.
