Lake-Lehman Starts Enrollment For Fall

Lake-Lehman is already enrolling kindergarten children and first grade pupils for next September, according to a bulletin of instruction issued to parents by Robert Z. Belles, Elementary Supervisor, and distributed through Noxen, Lake, Lehman and Ross Township elementary schools.

Eligible for kindergarten, any child who becomes five years of age before February 1, 1964; for first grade, any child who becomes six years of age before February 1, 1964.

Parents are reminded that once a child is enrolled in public school, he falls within the provisions of the Compulsory Attendance Law. Parents of kindergarten children are further reminded that no bus transportation will be furnished and that getting the children to and from school is strictly up to the parents.

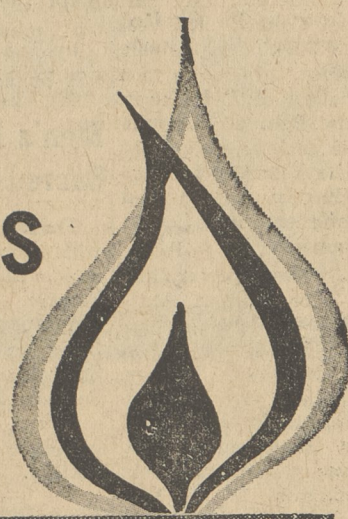
Correction

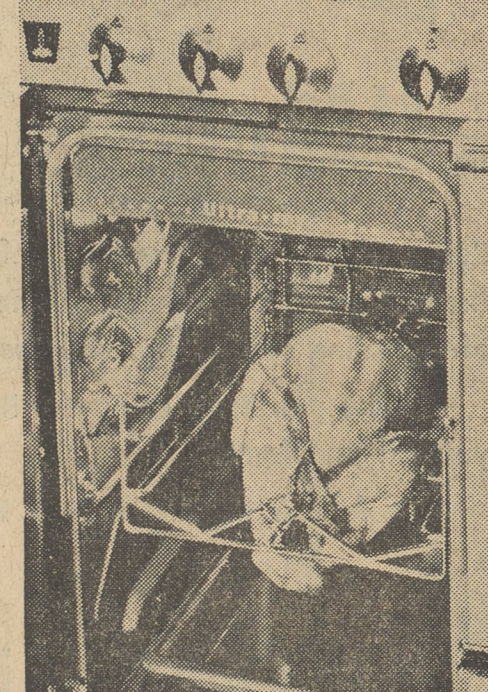
