

Louise Merrill Capps Dies Suddenly At 25

Louise Merrill Capps, former resident of Harveys Lake and for a time student at Laketon schools, died suddenly of a virus infection at Orlando, Florida, last Wednesday.

Only 25 years old, and with a brilliant future ahead of her as a histologist, she was at the time of her death supervisor of histology at Orange Memorial Hospital in Orlando. She had graduated from Memorial Hospital in Charlotte, N.C. before moving to Florida three years ago. She had graduated from Central High School in Charlotte.

Funeral services were conducted on Saturday from the Central Steel Creek Presbyterian Church and burial in the Capps family plot in Charlotte.

If we would stem the engulfing tide of self destruction seen all about us, let all mothers reestablish the happy households which we once respected and an awareness of godliness in their offspring.




