She had been in fairly good health until a serious illness developed suddenly fatal.

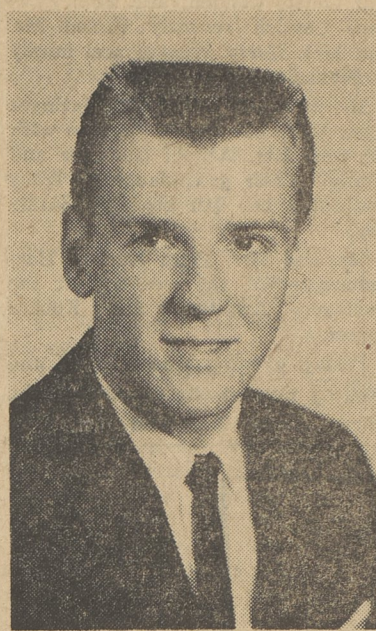
The daughter of the late Elisha and Ellen Hartman Gregory, she was born in Muhlenberg and attended schools in that area.

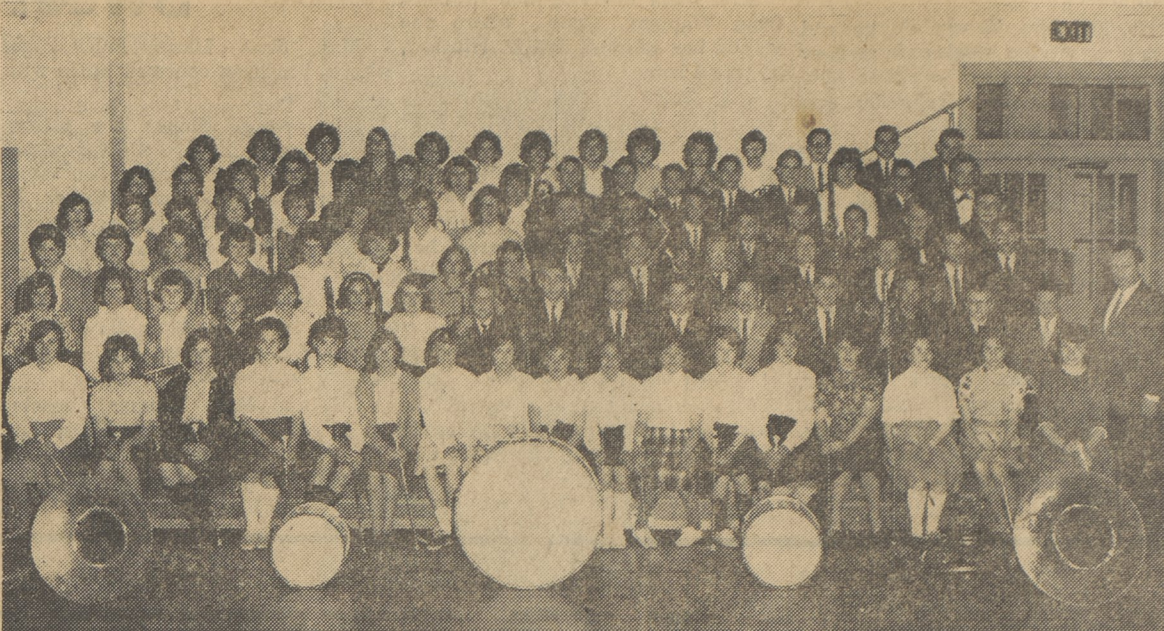
