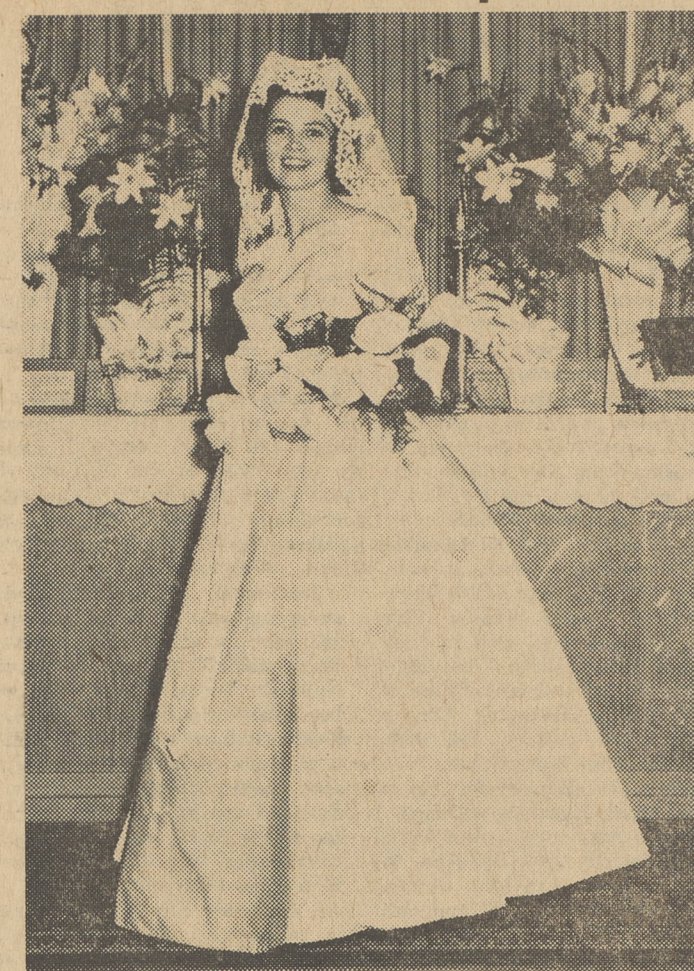

Mass.

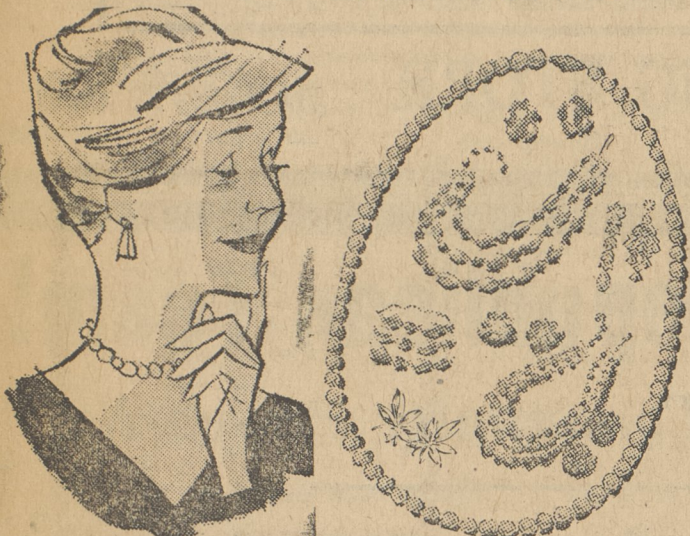

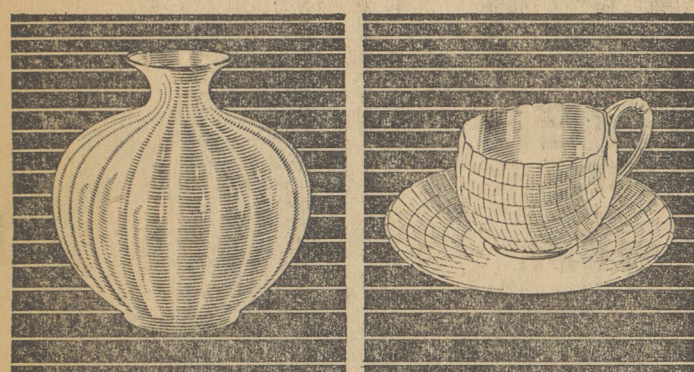

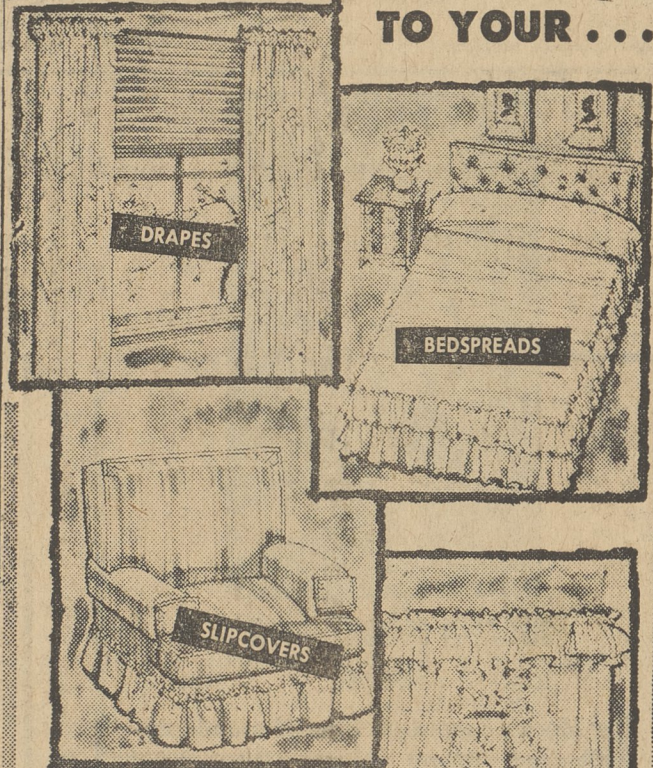
