Mrs. Martin was the recipient of many lovely gifts.

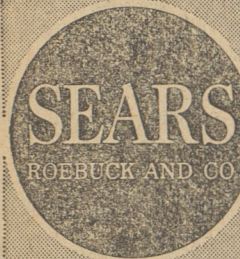
