 On Fathers Day, at 3:30 p. m., tribute will be paid to the Founding Fathers by breaking ground, when Back Mountain residents are invited to the ceremony.
 Actual date for beginning construction has not yet been set. Architect's plans are now in the hands of contractors.

Grove Armstrong, pastor of the church since 1956, who first launched the idea of a church edifice to be started in 1963; Mrs. Frank Mathers, Sunday School Superintendent; Frank Cooper, Jr., chairman of the local board of trustees; Elizabeth Jones, president of the Women's Missionary Society; Jean Blaine, president of the Free Methodist Youth; and Misses Ruth Rhone and Sophie Pizarro, representatives of the Junior Missionary Society. The Wilkes-Barre Society which meets with the Trucksville Society will also have a representative.

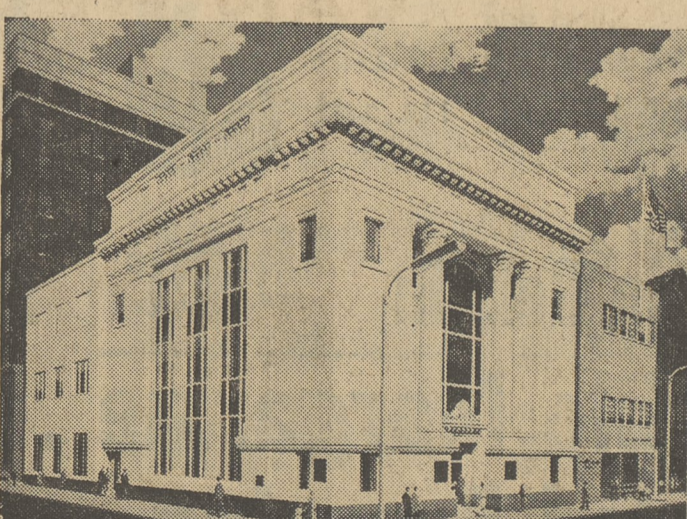
Seventh Day Adventists Prepare For Annual Camp Meeting June 28

 Jack Davis, elder of the local church, says that worship services for the local members will also emanate from the campsite for two weekends, when members will hear top church officials at the two Saturday morning services.

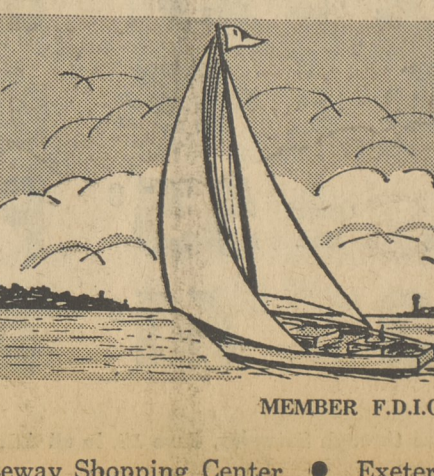
