Enlistments Open For 6-Month Reserve

Enlistments in the Army Reserve Six-Month Training Program are being accepted in the 402nd Military Police Prisoner of War Camp unit of Wilkes-Barre, which offers openings in Repair and Utilities, Medicine, Supply, Cooks, Records Section and many others.

Under the six-month active duty program, men between the ages of

17 and 26 may enlist in the Army Reserve. They will be called to active duty 120 days after enlistment for an 8-week basic training course, followed by a period of specialized training.
