The 402nd Military Police Prisoner of War Camp unit announced the promotion of Robert D. Richardson, Dallas, to the rank of 1st Lieutenant. First Lt. Richardson is now serving as Transportation Officer of the unit and is responsible for the movement of all troops and equipment during any drills or encampments the 402nd takes part in.

During an active duty situation, 1st Lt. Richardson would be in charge of a motor pool containing some 33 vehicles used to transport men and equipment in the unit as well as the 12,000 prisoners the 402nd is equipped to service. The vehicles range from jeeps, three-quarter ton trucks, two-and-a-half ton trucks to large tractor trailer rigs for transporting quantities of prisoners, as well as ambulances and small trailers.
