He is on a year's tour of duty. His address is 6220 ABRON, APO 143, San Francisco, California.

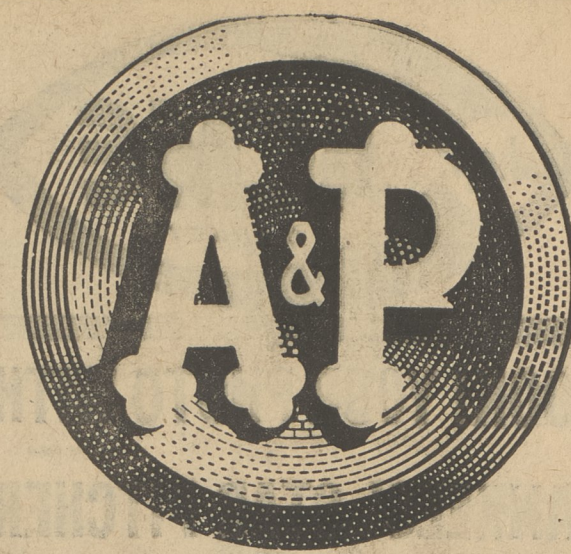
### Two-Day Doe Session
