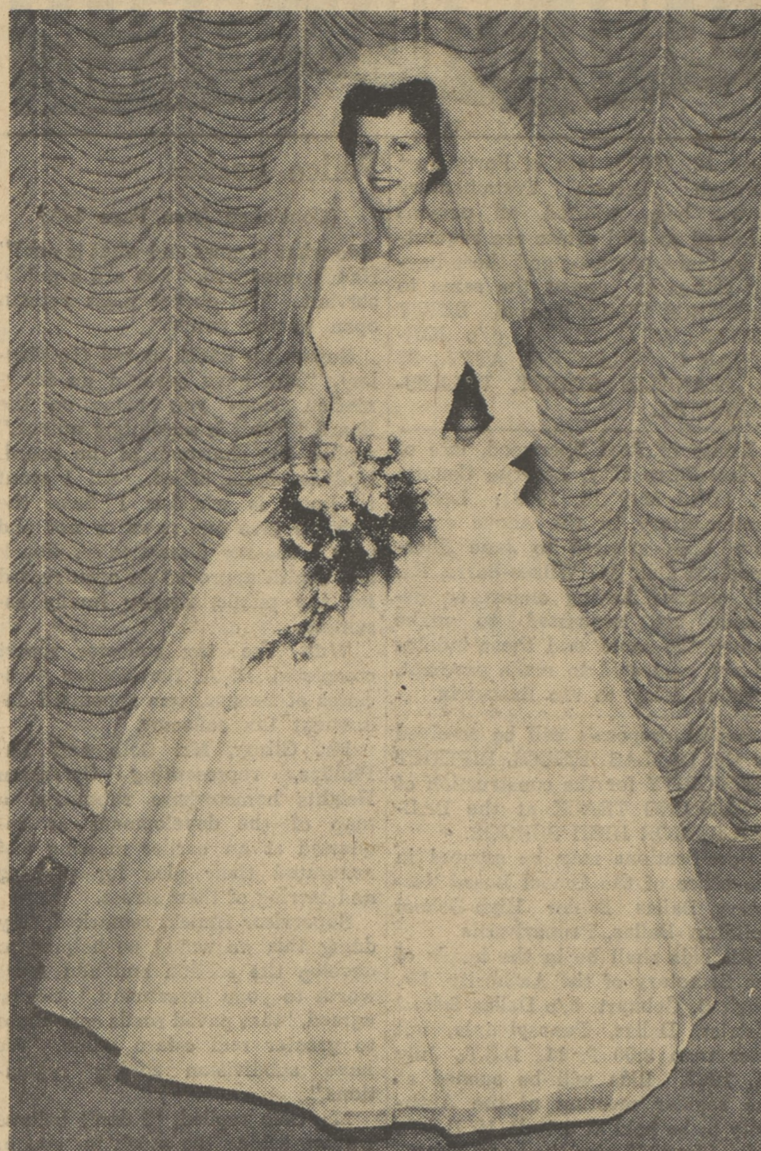
## Hold Bon Voyage Party For English Travelers
