Myra Carlin drove to Snowshoe to visit her brother Raymond and family over the 4th.

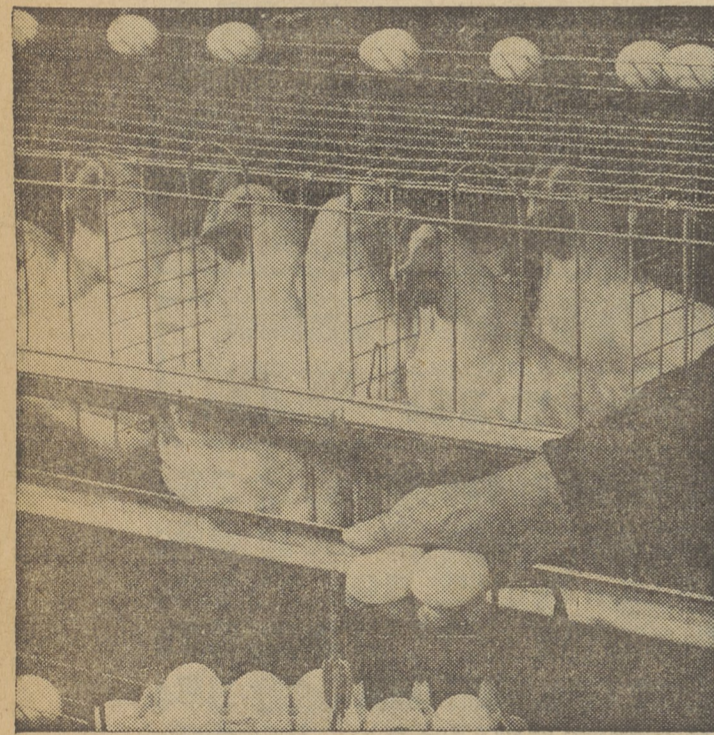
Walter Shutt, brother of Irene Moore, was taken to Nesbitt Hospital last Thursday in serious condition.
