Every available publicity and educational medium should be used to stimulate an interest and desire for good conservation programs. This can be done by radio, television, newspapers, speakers and well placed posters and will transmit and create interest in the project. I might add that conservation clubs for young people are very important, and no community should be without one. I am happy to say that I have been helping in this project by talking to groups and on radio, besides writing this column each week. My big job is to start a Junior Conservation Club in our area. I hope with your help that this project can and will be done.

I may add that, being a member of the National Council of Junior Outdoorsmen, I would be happy to talk to your youth group.
