There are five children, Joseph, Robert, Ann Marie, Suzann and Thomas. The family are members of Gate of Heaven Church, Dallas.

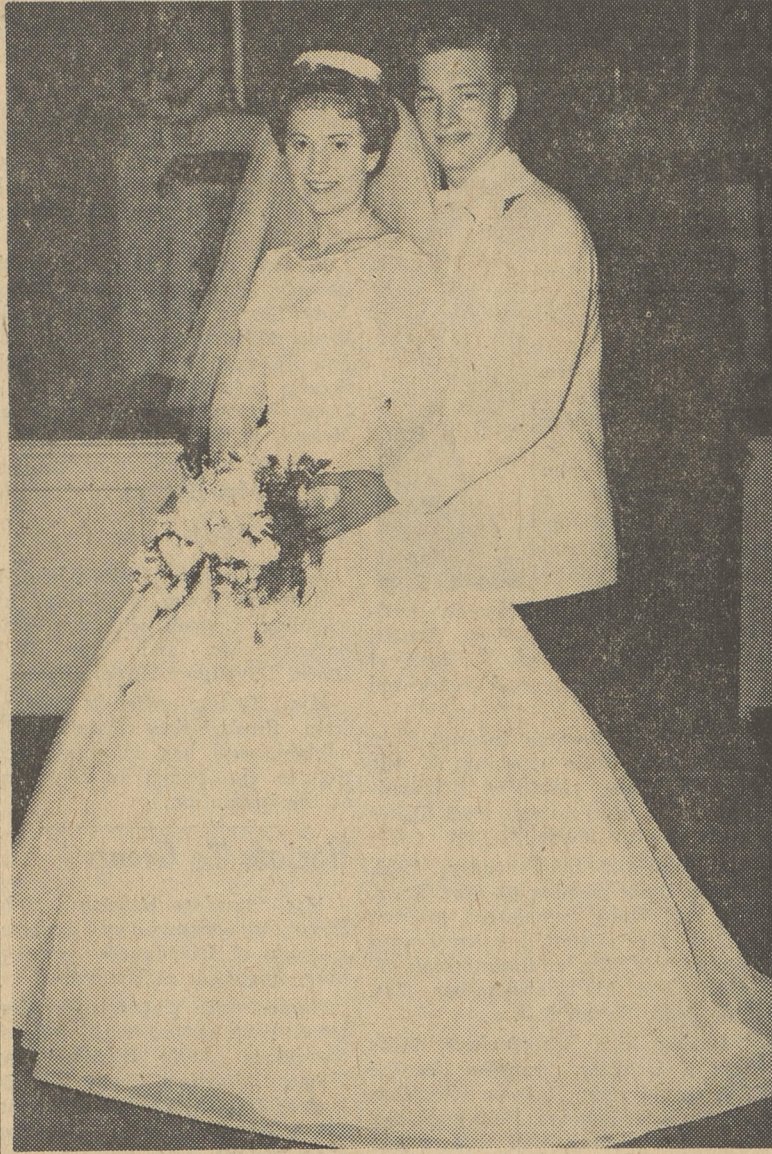
The Millers have lived in this area for the past eleven years. Mr. Miller is foreman of Central Wholesale Company, Wilkes-Barre.
